Life Notes

Close Encounters #4: "God's Faithfulness Over Time"

Exodus 1:8-14; 3:1-15; Hebrews 11:23-28, 32-40

Opener: Read about the heroes of faith in Hebrews 11:32-40. Whose story resonates with you the most, and why?

Go Deeper:

- 1. Identify any promises made by God to Abraham (Genesis 12:2-3) and connect them to the situation in Egypt. How were God's promises seemingly threatened during this time?
- 2. Read Hebrews 11:23-28. Talk about how Moses endured suffering and rejection for the sake of God's promise. What can you learn from his endurance in the face of opposition?
- 3. What does it mean in verse 26 that Moses "... regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward"?
- 4. Read Hebrews 11:39-40. What do you think it means that "... none of them received what had been promised, since God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect"?
- 5. Discuss instances where individuals did not see the fulfillment of God's promises during their lifetime. What kept them faithful despite not witnessing the fulfillment of what was promised?

Live It:

- 1. Share a promise or plan in your life that seems delayed or unfulfilled. How can the Israelites' waiting period in Egypt serve as a reminder that God's promises are worth waiting for?
- 2. Where do you see Jesus amidst suffering or waiting in your life?
- 3. Read 2 Peter 3:8. What does this Biblical truth mean for your life?
- 4. What specifically is God saying to you?
- 5. What specifically are you going to do about it this week?






Simple, but it can change your day.





Pastor Todd and Anne Mathison are hosting this pilgrimage along with 13 other people connected with Victory Lutheran and 14 other friends from across the country. They embark on this Spiritual Pilgrimage October 4-14, following the footsteps of the Apostle Paul on his journey to Rome.

They will first land in Malta, starting with a prayer service at San Pawl Miliqui, a chapel opened only once per year but special access being given for our group. Then visits to St. Paul's Church and St. Paul's Catacombs, culminating in a boat excursion to the very location where the Apostle Paul's ship encountered disaster (read Acts chapter 27).

A ferry transports the team to the island of Sicily, exploring majestic Mt Etna, and then the cities of Mdina and Siracusa, where Paul visited with Christians on his way to Rome (read Acts chapter 28).

Then on toward Rome, where the group will retrace Paul's steps along the historic Appian Way, just as he did when meeting with the Elders from Rome at the Three Taverns. Then visits to the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Wall, the San Callisto Catacombs, the Vatican museums, and Mamertine Prison where Paul endured captivity.

Victory Lutheran is pleased to offer spiritual pilgrimages such as this. Pray for our pilgrims as they follow Paul's journey to Rome, that they may find their faith deepened and spirits rejuvenated.
