#### Life Notes

# re:FORMING #2: "From Ordinary to Extraordinary"

2 Samuel 5:1-5

**Opener:** Share the name of someone in your life who has inspired you through their faithfilled actions. What qualities did they possess that made their lives extraordinary?

#### Go Deeper:

- 1. Explore 1 Samuel 16:7. How does this verse illuminate the way God sees the heart, not just the outward appearance? How can this perspective shape the way we view ourselves and others in the context of God's calling?
- 2. Share a personal experience of facing a trial or challenge. How did that experience shape your character and faith?
- 3. Discuss the concept of divine calling. Why do you think God often calls people in the midst of their everyday tasks? How does this challenge our perception of what is considered significant in God's eyes?
- 4. In what ways can we surrender our will to God during difficult times, allowing Him to refine us?

#### Live It:

- Reflect on your own life journey. In what way might you perceive yourself as ordinary? How might God be shaping your ordinary moments for a grand purpose?
- 2. Read Jeremiah 1:5. How does this verse relate to the idea that God forms us with a purpose even before we are born? Discuss the significance of God's knowledge of us before our earthly existence.
- 3. Read James 1:2-4. How does this passage provide a perspective on trials and the formation of our faith? How can we find joy amidst challenges, knowing that God uses them to mold us into vessels of His glory?
- 4. As a group, spend time in prayer, surrendering your challenges and imperfections to God. Ask for His strength and wisdom to navigate through difficult times, trusting in His transformative power.

#### **GOD TIME:**

Have you ever considered what constitutes a miracle? Biblically speaking, miracles involve the direct and powerful action of God doing something uncommon, supernatural, and usually awe-inspiring in order to reveal himself to the world. Miracles are extraordinary and can be a bit overwhelming when they are experienced firsthand. Did you know God is doing miraculous things among us here in the Victory church family?

In the short time I have been here at Victory, I have witnessed both small and large miracles among the people of God. One in particular happened this past week.

My journey with this person began right after I arrived, and I visited them in the hospital. They were not doing well and as time progressed the doctors told them they needed to get their affairs in order. The doctors told them the only treatment to offer was to help keep this person comfortable in their final days. When I received word of the doctor's report, I took communion to this patient. During our prayer time, we asked Jesus to show us that He is still a God of miracles, and we would take even the smallest of miracles from Jesus in response to the faithful prayers of this person.

Then, on Monday, I walked into their room at a care center, fully expecting the person to be closer to going home to Jesus than to their home in Mesa. However, they were sitting up in a chair talking with family and friends. Wow, talk about a miracle! We all teared up as talked about the doctor's plan to begin teaching them how to walk again. God sure gave them a miracle, and not just a tiny miracle either. This was a big miracle we praise God for. So yes, God is on the move among us, listening to our prayers "Time spent <u>daily</u> alone in fellowship and answering us in miraculous, unexpected, faith building ways that draw us closer to His heart.

### GO TIME: Pilgrimage "In the Footsteps of the Apostle Paul" Gio Begano, AVL Coordinator



We experienced many moments of friendship and fun, along with deeply fulfilling looks into the history of our faith. We visited many churches, chapels, and catacombs that had been built not just hundreds of years ago, but thousands in some cases. I will never forget the fresco of Jesus Christ in the Saint Callixtus Catacombs in Rome, that had been painted in the 8th Century after Christ.



I had a lot of moments of that same feeling and reflection, informed by the sermon we had last heard from Pastor Todd: "God's Faithfulness Over Time," in which one point stood out in particular: "God's faithfulness is not bound by time." This is a belief that I experienced firsthand throughout the trips, being in the presence these ancient
