Life Notes

re:FORMING #1: "God's Unfolding Grace"

Ruth 1:1-17; Ephesians 2:1-10; Psalm 126

Opener: The Book of Ruth takes place at a very dark time in Israel's history. (Read Judges 2:10-13 for context), What reason did the author give for the Israelites doing evil in the sight of the Lord? How might knowing what was going on in the culture Naomi and Ruth lived in influence the way we approach our reading of the Book of Ruth?

Go Deeper:

- 1. Read Ruth 1:1-17. What is the first thing you notice about the three women at the heart of this story?
- 2. In verses 8-13, as Naomi, Orpah and Ruth start out on the journey, what reasons does Naomi give Orpah and Ruth for going back to their families and gods?
- 3. In verse 14 Orpah leaves. As Ruth watches her sister-in-law, why doesn't she go with her?
- 4. Read Ruth 1:16-17 again. What reasons does Ruth give for wanting to stay with Ruth? Whose God does she want to surrender her life to: the gods of Moab or the God of Israel? What is the significance in Ruth's surrendering her life to the One True God of Israel?
- 5. In this story we have three women, three losses, and 3 different responses. Where is God's grace in each of these women's lives? Is God's grace limited by our impossible circumstances like those Naomi, Orpah and Ruth find themselves in?

Live It:

- 1. Ruth didn't allow her suffering to define her. Instead she allowed God's grace, given to her in these impossible circumstances, to refine and re:FORM her. What about us?
- 2. Where are you experiencing God's grace in this season of your life?
- 3. Naomi, "...heard in Moab that the Lord had come to the aid of his people by providing food for them." (verse 6) If God can send word to Naomi in a far off land, is there anywhere we can go that is too far for God's grace to reach us?
- 4. God's grace is still reaching out to the world, calling people home to His heart. Is there someone in your life God is calling you to share His grace with? If so, how will you respond?

GOD TIME: The Anchor in the Storm


When we face problems and daily disruptions seem to have become the norm, it's human to feel fragile and afraid. However, during these tough times, we shouldn't forget the peace that comes from trusting in God's protection. Jesus once said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27). He's telling us directly: He's given us peace, not the temporary kind, but lasting peace that stays through life's ups and downs.

Remember, the Bible is filled with stories of God helping people in scary situations. Think of David defeating Goliath for example — he won not because he was strong, but because he trusted God. We're in a similar spot when we face our fears. The problems are real, but God is with us, and He's stronger than any issue we're up against.

So, what do we do when everything seems too much? We should stop relying solely on our efforts. Instead, let's turn to prayer and remind ourselves that God is in control. His protection doesn't mean the absence of problems, but it means we're not alone in them. By trusting Him, we find the strength to not be fearful, even when the world is chaotic.

Meditate today on these other verses and may "the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:7)

That was the one commitment Don allowed me to continue, as long as I took care of him. He and Dan built the cupboards to store the bedding and air mattresses. He also built the shelves in the shower room so we could store towels.

After Don passed away, taking care of my ladies became even more important. It motivated me to get up every morning. I didn't have much time to sit around and moan in grief. We have just incredible teams of people that prepare meals, come in and set up the beds and they love it. We all have fun together and it's just a very nice way to serve and to do something sort of quietly behind the scenes.


