Hope Has a Name #2: "Comfort in the Chaos" December 9 & 10, 2023 Isaiah 40:1-11

Opener (choose one):

- 1. Share a comfort item or habit you turn to when you need a "pick-me-up."
- 2. Imagine we're creating a "Comfort Playlist." Share one song that brings you comfort or joy, and briefly explain why.

Go Deeper:

- 1. What historical challenges were God's people facina durina Isaiah's time, and why was the concept of comfort so foreign to them?
- 2. In what ways does Isaiah contrast the transient nature of human life with the enduring nature of God's Word (verses 6-8)? How does this comparison impact our perspective on life's challenges?
- 3. Discuss the portrayal of God as a shepherd in Isaiah 40:10. How does this image reconcile the idea of God's might and gentleness?
- 4. How does Isaiah 53:6-7 connect with the themes of comfort and redemption presented in Isaiah 40:1-11? What deeper understanding does this connection bring to the concept of God's comfort?

Live It:

- 1. How does the idea of preparing a road in the desert resonate with the uncertainties we face in life? Share an example of a time when you had to trust God in the midst of uncertainty.
- 2. Discuss the tendency to deny or ignore brokenness in our lives. In what ways do we see this tendency in ourselves or others? How can we create a space for acknowledging and admitting our need for God's comfort?
- 3. Reflect on a recent or ongoing adversity in your life. How have you tried to find comfort in the midst of it? How might Isaiah's message influence your approach to seeking comfort?
- 4. Read Isaiah 53:6-7 and how Christ bore our sins. How does this reflection impact your understanding of God's comfort? In what ways can this reflection influence your daily walk with God?
- 5. What is God's Word saying to you?
- 6. What specifically are you going to do about it this week?

Are we listening?

In **1 Samuel 3**, Samuel is called to serve the Lord. At this time in history, hearing from the Lord was a rarity, and he was giving no visible signs of his presence. But, something happens one night while Samuel is sleeping. Samuel is awakened by the voice of the Lord. He thinks Eli is calling him. Three times in the narrative, Samuel appears before Eli saying, "Here I am!" because he mistakes God's voice for his teacher's voice. Then, Eli teaches Samuel to listen to the Lord. He "perceives" the Lord is calling young Samuel, and "Time spent daily he provides a valuable lesson on the way each of us should respond. Eli says to with God." Samuel, "Go, lie down, and if He calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." (v. 9).
