Life Notes

"The Time Has Come" December 30 & 31, 2023

Mark 1:1-20

Opener:

Do you remember your own baptism? What about the baptism of a child/grandchild or special person in your life. What do you remember the most about the event?

Go Deeper:

- 1. Read Luke 1:67-79. What did Zachariah say John the Baptist was to do before Jesus started His ministry? How do these verses compare to Isaiah 40:3-5?
- 2. Read Luke 1:4-8. John strode onto the stage of history as the "voice of one calling in the desert." What was the key message Joh was preaching? Who would be coming after John?
- 3. Read Luke 1:4 again. What is the difference between John's baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins and being baptized with the Holy Spirit?
- 4. Read Luke 1:9-11. What was the significance of Jesus being baptized by John? (Matthew 3:13-15)

Live It:

- 1. In the waters of the River Jordan, the baton was passed from John to Jesus – from messenger to Messiah. From that point on, wherever Jesus was found, the kingdom of God was nearby. Where is the kingdom of God nearby in your life?
- 2. As the voice of the Father boomed out the message was clear; the Son of God is among you! Jesus, the Son of God is able to do something no one else can do reconnect us with the Father. In this time of your life, how do you feel connected with God the Father; God the Son; and or God the Holy Spirit?
- Jesus announces, "the time has come! Repent and believe the good news!" (vs 15) How is this "good news" in your life?
- 4. Jesus called His first disciples saying, "Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of men!" (vs 17) and in verse 18 we see the men leaving all they had and following Jesus. How has Jesus called you to follow Him? What, if anything, has He asked you to "leave" to follow Him?



My name is Judy Bialk and my Journey of faith grew in leaps and bounds after I joined Victory Church. In our old church my husband Bill of 60 years was very active. He was a lay leader and served on many committees. After his death I felt I no longer belonged there. I visited Victory and knew that this is where God wanted me to be. story starts when I had a disagreement with one of our Pastors. I was really upset and did not answer calls and stopped going to church. We finally got together with a few of my friends, and everything got straightened out. He offered Communion to us. He gave it to my

friends and then asked me to give it to him as he kneeled before me. I took the host and as I was giving it to him, I felt warmth overtaking me, I shook, and tears came to my eyes. I can truly say I felt the Holy Spirit in me. I have never felt that way before. We sang, prayed, and hugged. It was a day I will always remember. I have lost 3 people in 3 years whom I have loved. My husband Bill, my son to suicide, and my daughter drowning. Through all of this I would not have survived if I did not have my faith, my church, and the Holy Spirit within me.
