Life Notes

Kingdom, Power & Glory #6: "Open Mouth, Insert Foot"

Mark 8:27-38; 9:2-8

Opener:

Who is your favorite Apostle of Jesus? Why? Is there something about their temperament that you can relate to? Is there some quality in this person that you admire?

Go Deeper:

- 1. Mark 9:2 says that "after 6 days Jesus took Peter, James, and John with Him and led them up a high mountain..." Reflect on what all the disciples have experienced in the 6 days leading up to the Transfiguration. (Refer to Mark 8:27-38)
- 2. Discuss what may have been going through the disciple's minds when in Mark 8:33 Jesus rebuked Peter. We don't know from Mark's text what Peter said to Jesus. but what do you think Peter may have said to cause such a reaction by Jesus?
- 3. Moses and Elijah appeared with Jesus during the Transfiguration (Mark 9:4) and were talking to Him. What do you imagine that they were discussing with Him? If you were Moses or Elijah what would you be asking Jesus?
- 4. Directly after the Transfiguration Jesus tells Peter, James, and John to "not tell anyone what they had seen" until the Son of Man had risen from the dead." (Mark 9:9). Why do you think Jesus said this to them? Would you have been able to keep this secret?

Live It:

- 1. Reflect on a time in your life when you were quick to react and slow to listen. What value is there in listening first to understand then to be understood?
- 2. In what ways do our own expectations of who God should be get in the way of Who God really is. What are some things we can do to safeguard against this happening?
- 3. The Transfiguration story once again reveals that Jesus is God. Jesus took all your sins to the cross with Him. Pray about how you can share this truth with someone who needs to hear it.

GOD TIME: LENT — WHAT WILL YOU GIVE UP OR ADD TO YOUR SPIRITUAL LIFE?

As you know, we here at Victory are preparing to embark on a Lenten journey over the next 40 days. The pastors and staff are excited to be walking together with our Savior Jesus Christ and with you on a journey of transformation this Lenten season. This year on Ash Wednesday you will receive a 40-day devotional to help draw our hearts closer to the heart of God.



GO TIME

We know that traditionally, Lent is known as a solemn season of fasting, penance, and repentance. Ash Wednesday begins our journey to the cross with Jesus Christ. The 40 days of Lent remind us of Jesus' Baptism where, according to Mark 1, the Holy Spirit drives Him into the wilderness for 40 days.

According to Matthew and Luke, Jesus fasts during this time. At the end of the 40 days, He is tempted by the devil. Not only is He victorious over Satan, but according to Luke 4, Jesus "returned in the power of the Holy Spirit" where He goes to Galilee to begin His ministry.

The days of Lent have traditionally been "fast" days. The Sundays in Lent are considered "feast" days. The traditional Gospel Acclamation during Lent changes to "Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." (Joel 2:13) During this season of Lent we want to follow Jesus' lead and return to the Lord our God by walking in the Spirit. I encourage you to remember fasting is not just giving up food and drink. It is a way of praying and desiring God above all else. This year, we encourage you to use the 40-day devotional as a way to "add something" to your spiritual life. Our prayer for you is that you will use this devotional as a daily guide to help you grow deeper in your faith. We pray also for the Holy Spirit to use this devotional to strengthen your covenant relationship with God so that we, like our Lord, may return to ministry after Easter filled with the power of the Holy Spirit!
