Embrace our calling, being bold witnesses to God's grace, bringing hope to a needy world.

April 13 & 14 - "In the Name of Jesus" - Acts 3:1-10

Peter and John go to the temple to pray where they encounter a man lame from birth. Peter heals the man in the name of Jesus Christ and he walks, leaps, and praises God in front of the crowds. But this story isn't just a historical tale; it's a reminder of the transformative power of faith and

As Sis Ntosh continues to earn income she grows closer to fulfilling her passion of caring for vulnerable babies. This is why Orchard: Africa wants to see people equipped with tangible skills! People find hope, passions are pursued and communities develop.

Victory is now entering a 1 year partnership with Orchard: Africa to continue to improve this gathering center that allows local church leaders to have a place to congregate to receive training in small scale agriculture, early childhood education, small business development, orphan care, and church strengthening. The Impact Center is also a gathering network for pastors, empowerment programs for women facing gender based violence, young parent workshops and future leader youth development courses.




Dementia/Alzheimer Care Partner Seminar - April 18


FAIR TRADE SALE - April 14 (After 9:30am Service)
