Life Notes

The Ultimate Question #2: Rejected by the People

February 24 & 25, 2024 Matthew 27:15-26

Opener:

Share a time when you experienced rejection in your life. How did it feel, and how did you cope with it?

Go Deeper:

- 1. In Matthew 27:15-26, what role does Pilate play in the rejection of Jesus? How does his decision-making process reflect common human tendencies?
- 2. How does Jesus' rejection by the people contrast with his innocence, as highlighted in Matthew 27:17-24?
- 3. Reflecting on Isaiah 53:1-3, how did the rejection of Jesus fulfill Old Testament prophecy? What significance does this hold in understanding Jesus' identity?

Live It:

- 1. Consider the objections people commonly have towards Jesus, such as intellectual doubts or resistance to change. How can you effectively address these objections with love and understanding, while still affirming the truth of the Gospel?
- 2. In what ways might we unintentionally reject Jesus in our daily lives? How can we actively ensure that we are not rejecting Him?
- 3. Think of a time when you witnessed someone being rejected or excluded. How can you embody Christ-like love and acceptance in similar situations going forward?
- 4. Read 2 Corinthians 5:21. What does this "great exchange" mean to you personally?
- 5. Read Luke 9:23 and John 8:11. Jesus calls for complete surrender and life change. What steps can you take this week to align your life more closely with His teachings?



My name is Jim Wester. I attended the Grandparenting Matters class last month and was moved to share with you a letter I wrote addressed to the grandkids of my best friend that recently passed away. He was an amazing friend and grandparent.

GROUP TIME: Meaningful Connections — Grandparents Matter!

"You probably have never heard of me, but I'm a grandpa too. I'm Grandpa Jim. I met your grandpa many years ago back in the late 60's when he came down to the city to work at the caterpillar dealer where I was employed. We became friends right away as I could see this was a man that I would enjoy being around and we shared common interests.

Your grandpa and I began playing golf together and even though he tried to help me with my game, I soon realized that I would never make it to his level. However, I was good at fishing. Long before you were born, Grandpa Gerry asked if he could join me for the Walleye Fishing Opener in 1978. That year, with the exception of 2020, we never missed an opener.

Your grandpa and I became like brothers. We shared everything together some good and some bad, but mostly good. Like the birth of each one of you. I can't think of a time when your grandpa visited you kids that he didn't have a word of praise or a fun story to tell such as, "Gampa, why do you call a sammich, a sammich?" He never told me the answer. I think we were laughing too hard.

Grandpas are proud of their kids, but as a grandpa of 11 grandkids, I can tell you that somehow grandparents like your Gerry & Mary think grandkids are just a little bit extra special. Your parents have accomplished much in their lives and I know that your grandpa would expect no less out of each of you. Your grandpa had a very strong faith in the Lord. Just to know that will help me get through this very difficult loss of a man that I loved. Today, it is my prayer that you will keep your grandpa in your thoughts as you achieve all the dreams which he had for you."
