Opener:

Go Deeper:

- 1. In Matthew 26:36-41, what was Jesus' request to his disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane?
- 2. What do you think Jesus meant by saying, "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak"?
- 3. In Matthew 26:33-35, what did Peter declare to Jesus in response to his prediction of their desertion?
- 4. Why do you think Peter was so confident about his loyalty to Jesus?
- 5. What role did Judas play among Jesus' disciples, and why do you think he agreed to betray Jesus?
- 6. What do you think you might have done if you were with Jesus in the garden when he was arrested?

Live It:

- 1. What practical steps can you take to prioritize prayer and spiritual practices even in times of fatigue or fear?
- 2. How can cultivating humility in your spiritual life help you avoid the pitfalls of pride?
- 3. How might unmet expectations and desires for material gain lead to spiritual disillusionment?
- 4. How might regular self-reflection and prayer help you realign your priorities and follow Jesus rather than worldly pursuits?
- 5. What is God saying to you?
- 6. What specifically are you going to do about it this week?



In Communion with Christ: A Story of Shirley Kirking

One of the first visits I made after arriving at Victory was to a 99-year-old woman named Shirley Kirking. On our first visit, I asked about her faith life. She explained she had been a Lutheran all her life and then went on to tell me story after story about how God had always guided her life.

Over the past few months, I have looked forward to our visits. Shirley has a deep abiding faith in her Lord Jesus, and she is always quick to share a story about how she has experienced His love since the last time I saw her.

I especially enjoy sharing the voice of Jesus found in Luke 22:19-20 as we discuss how our Lord Jesus gave us the New Covenant we celebrate as Holy Communion. Then, we take time to talk about how Jesus tells us that each time we eat the bread and drink the wine we should do it in remembrance of Him.

When I ask Shirley what we are remembering she often folds her hands together. Then interlocking her fingers, and placing her hands over her heart, with tears in her eyes, she tells me she is remembering that Jesus "did it for me!" She tells me she is remembering that Jesus gave His body and shed His blood for her. She tells me, "Jesus died for me! Jesus gave His life for me!" Then we humbly share this meal of grace together.

I know Shirley is going to be 100 years old this November, but I think she is still helping others learn how to cherish time with our Lord Jesus at the communion table as we remember all He did for us!

Fifty years ago, my husband had a stroke which robbed him of the use of his left arm and partial use of his left leg. He worked very hard at physical therapy to regain the use of both and succeeded. However, unbeknownst to us, that stroke started his journey to dementia and some of his behaviors began to change. We all tried to live with those changes – not knowing the cause or a cure and then those symptoms showed themselves to be dementia. He has again lost the use of his left arm and leg, his memories are going, but he

remains cheerful. And I have been so blessed to have gotten so much help in dealing with all his changes. God has directed me to many people both for support and education.
