Opener:

When was the last school reunion you attended? In one sentence, describe what it was like to go back there.

Go Deeper:

- 1. What do Ruth's words in Ruth 1:16-17 reveal about her character and her faith?
- 2. Why does Naomi want to be called Mara, and what does this name change signify about her feelings and experiences?
- 3. How do Naomi's words in Ruth 1:20-21 reflect her view of God's role in her suffering?
- 4. Despite Naomi's bitterness, how can we see God's providence and faithfulness already at work in this passage?
- 5. What does this story suggest about the ways God can work through our relationships and commitments?

Live It:

- 1. Have you ever experienced a time when life's circumstances made you feel bitter or empty like Naomi? How did you cope with those feelings?
- 2. In what ways can you relate to Ruth's decision to leave everything familiar behind to embrace a new faith and community?
- 3. Can you identify a situation in your life where, looking back, you now see God's provision and guidance even if it wasn't clear at the time?
- 4. In what ways can you contribute to making Victory Lutheran Church a place of welcome and support for those who feel like outsiders?
- 5. What is God saying to you specifically?
- 6. What step of faith is God calling you to live in this coming week?
