Israel is a "hot topic" whether it is on the agenda at the United Nations or the reason for a college protest or the subject of conversation among friends. #### FROM NEWS SOURCES AFTER OCTOBER 7

**10/31/2023, L A Times: "Battling antisemitism on college campuses"** by Erwin Chemerinsky, dean of the U.C. Berkeley School of Law. "As a 70-year-old Jewish man, nothing in my life has prepared me for the last three weeks." [His observations and comments in this article sounded as shocked as Herzl was hearing the cries of "Death to the Jews" at the Dreyfus trial.]

11/1/23, U.S.A. Today: "My father, Elie Wiesel, survived Auschwitz. He'd ask these questions about the Israel/Hamas war" by Elisha Wiesel. "When you chant that Palestine should be free "from the river to the sea," what does that mean? What happened when Israel unilaterally withdrew from Gaza in 2005? What is the stated goal of Hamas? How should Israel defend its population when Hamas hides behind civilians? What would happen to Israel if it pulled completely out of the West Bank tomorrow as it did with Gaza? Ask these hard questions and others. And be smart enough to know when someone is telling a half-truth. Do your research."

11/6/23, afternoon news on CNN: A replay of interviews with Hamas leaders on Jordanian TV. Question: Why spend so much on tunnels for Hamas and yet no bomb shelters for the civilians? We need the tunnels to protect Hamas. The majority of the Gazans are refugees. It is the responsibility of the U.N. to take care of refugees. Question: What about the thousands of civilians being killed? Martyrs! We are a people who are ready to be martyrs. We are a nation of martyrs ready to die for the cause. Other nations have sacrificed many thousands of civilians in their righteous causes. That is what we are doing. A final comment: We will rise up again and again. October 7 was only one attack. There will be another and another and another.

11/10/23, L A Times: "There is only one answer for what happens next in Gaza" by Daoud Kuttab, former Princeton professor of journalism. "The idea of including Hamas or someone appointed by Hamas to be part of a solution to the current cycle of violence might seem anathema to many, but it is the only effective and logical way forward after a cease-fire. It ought to be demanded by the international community and even by Israel as a means to guarantee the stability needed for rebuilding Gaza and for entering serious negotiations that can produce an independent Palestinian state."

11/17/23, L A Times: Forensic doctors trying to I.D. the dead and how they died. Dr. Chen Kugel, head of the forensic center: "Perhaps you had the belief that one day you could make a compromise for peace. But when you see this, you understand it is not the leadership. It is not politics. It is real hatred...We don't bomb Gaza to teach them a lesson. We do it because we learned our lesson. We cannot survive like this. Everyone felt the threat to their existence."

Letter to the Editor, L A Times, reacting to an 11/19 piece, "What the Gaza killings look like to a scholar of genocide" by Raz Segal. "The implication is that Israel is the bad guy since it has killed more people than Hamas. But body counts do not define who is the aggressor and who is the victim. If they did, it would mean that the Germans were the victims in World War II, the North Koreans were the victims in the Korean War..."

#### 11/23/23, L A Times, citing various chants of the Pro-Palestinian protestors:

"Resistance is justified if Palestine is occupied."

From Bibi, My Story, pages 40-41. An Englishman, an American, and an Israeli were captured by a tribe of cannibals. When they were in the pot, each one was allowed a last wish. The Englishman asked for a whiskey and a pipe and got them. The American asked for a steak and got it. The Israeli asked the chief to give him a good kick in the backside. The chief was confused, but he did it. At once the Israeli pulled out a gun and shot all the cannibals. The Englishman and the American asked him, "If you had a gun all the time, why didn't you shoot them earlier?" He answered, "Are you crazy? And have the U.N. call me the aggressor?"

**Feb. 2024, L A Times**: Palestinians in Gaza are starting to turn against Hamas but not because of Oct 7 that brought Israeli retribution, but because Hamas had not stockpiled enough supplies to provide for the people's needs, given everyone knew Israel would retaliate. They are angry because Hamas should have planned better.
