


Advent Communion Service Wednesday, December 11 @ 4:00pm

Sermon Series: Behold A Savior Is Born

Christmas is the fulfillment of hundreds of years of prophetic predictions about the coming of the Messiah who would change the world. God's people waited for a Savior who would come to rescue and restore a broken creation. They held onto hope that God would stay true to his promise. With joy, they anticipated Christ's arrival. As a humble servant, Jesus' loved all he encountered from the cradle to the cross. The world would know the peace of God, who had come near. Behold, our Savior is born, the world will never be the same.



NOV 30 & DEC 1 — The Promised Hope — Isaiah 7:14, 53:1-11 (Communion at all Services)

This sermon sets the foundation for the series by exploring the prophecies of Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection. We will look at how the anticipation of the coming Messiah had been foreseen centuries before, giving hope to the people of God that salvation would come through Him.

DEC 7 & 8 — The Joy of Anticipation — Luke 1:39-56, 2:8-20

We experience excitement and joy as Christmas approaches. But what about that first Christmas? We will dive into the emotions of Mary, the shepherds, and others involved in the anticipation of Jesus' birth, which parallels the anticipation of the prophecies being fulfilled and how it was a cause for celebration. We still experience the joy of anticipation as we await our Savior's second coming.

DEC 14 & 15 — The Servant Love of Jesus — Luke 2:1-7; Philippians 2:5-11

Jesus came into the world in the most humble and unexpected manner. There is tremendous significance of God taking on human form as a vulnerable baby, emphasizing His humility and sacrificial love. Jesus' birth actually foreshadows His ultimate sacrifice on the cross.

DEC 21 & 22 - The Prophetic Peace - Isaiah 9:6-I 7; John 14:27

The peace that is offered in Jesus is different from the peace the world offers. God's peace can help us face the troubles of the world without fear. Though this prophetic promise of peace took a long time coming, it was fulfilled through the birth of our Savior.

DEC 24 — The Gift of Waiting — Candlelight Christmas Eve Services 1, 3, 5, 7, & 9pm (Communion at 9pm)

The peace that is offered in Jesus is different from the peace the world offers. God's peace can help us face the troubles of the world without fear. Though this prophetic promise of peace took a long time coming, it was fulfilled through the birth of our Savior.


DEC 25 — Confidence is Born — Matt. 1:18-25, 2 Cor. 3:4-6 — Christmas Day — 10am with Communion

Christmas Lights Bus Tours


December 3, 5, 10, 12, 17 @ 5:30pm
