January 4 & 5 – Discovering Jesus in Unexpected Placed – Luke 2:41-52 (Communion at all Services)

Uncover the remarkable wisdom Jesus displays in the temple, even as He humbly submitted to His earthly parents. Through this snapshot, God's grace shines brightly, assuring us that our salvation is founded not on our own understanding but on the perfect obedience of the Son. Marvel at Christ's heart for His Father's Word and His people, and glimpse the mercy of our Promised Messiah who meets us in our questions and leads us into the richness of His love.

January 11 & 12 — More Than a Renegade Prophet — Luke 3:1-22

Witness John the Baptist paving the way for Jesus, the Promised Messiah, by calling us to repent and receive God's boundless grace. Jesus' baptism not only reveals His divine identity but also assures us that our own baptism places us firmly in the arms of the Father's unmerited love. Celebrate that in Christ, God's grace breaks into our world, opening our eyes to the wonder of the Messiah who came to save.

January 18 & 19 – Messianic Mic-Drop – Luke 4:14-20

Standing in the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus openly declares Himself to be the long-awaited Messiah, fulfilling Isaiah's ancient prophecy of freedom and restoration. See how God's radical grace breaks into our everyday realities, turning our expectations upside down and giving hope to the weary. Anchored in the Biblical truth that we can do nothing to earn this favor, we rejoice in the good news that Christ's mission to redeem and restore continues today, even for us.

January 25 & 26 — The Day the Messiah Sank My Comfort Zone — Luke 5:1-11

The Messiah reaches into ordinary lives with extraordinary grace, calling humble fishermen into kingdom-shaping ministry. Through the miraculous catch of fish, Jesus reveals His divinity and compassion, assuring us that God meets us in our frailty and empowers us for His mission. Behold the Promised Messiah whose gracious invitation reorients our lives to proclaim God's boundless mercy in every corner of creation.


