March 8-9 — Forgiven To Forgive — Ephesians 4:32

The Bible powerfully exhorts us to "be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Through the cross, Christ extends grace beyond human comprehension, calling us to embody radical forgiveness in our own lives. By examining the depth of God's mercy toward us, we are challenged to cultivate hearts that mirror Jesus' love, releasing the chains of bitterness and resentment. And as we learn to forgive from a place of gratitude and humility, we become living testimonies of God's boundless grace in a broken world.

March 15-16 — Where You Belong — John 14:2-3


Jesus reassures His disciples that He has prepared a place for them in His Father's house. This promise extends to all who believe, offering not only the hope of eternal life but also the joy of belonging right now to the family of God. Even in our present circumstances, we can find rest and comfort in knowing that Christ has welcomed us into His household. Secure in this assurance, we have the freedom to extend that same invitation of belonging to others — reflecting God's generous love and opening the door to His Kingdom for every heart seeking a place to call home.

March 22-23 — Water Thicker Than Blood — Galatians 6:2

God calls us to carry one another's burdens, highlighting the profound truth that in Christ, we share a bond stronger than any earthly tie. Jesus establishes a new kind of family — His followers united in love, standing alongside one another through every trial. By embracing one another's struggles and joys, we reflect the depth and power of God's enduring family.

March 29-30 — Claimed & Embraced — Ephesians 1:11-14

Scripture declares that in Christ, we have been chosen, sealed, and given a glorious inheritance, given to us because Jesus was forsaken on the cross so that we need never be abandoned. Even in our darkest moments, God's faithfulness remains unshakable — He is present, He is at work, and He never leaves His children. Our adoption into God's family becomes the solid ground for our confidence and hope, reminding us that we are claimed, embraced, and held secure in Christ forever.





Lenten Sermon Series: FINAL WORDS — Eternal Impact

This year our Wednesday Lenten journey focus will take us to the foot of the cross where we will listen to the voice of our Savior Jesus speaking the last 7 statements He made before His death.

As you may know, Lent is traditionally known as a solemn season of fasting, penance, and repentance that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter morning. Lent is a time to reflect on Jesus's suffering and death, and to ask for forgiveness.


The days of Lent have traditionally been "fast" days. The Sundays in Lent are considered "feast" days. The traditional Gospel Acclamation during Lent changes from "Alleluia, Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." (John 6:68) to "Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." (Joel 2:13)

A dedicated team of prayer warriors have prepared a 40-day Lenten devotional for us use as a daily devotional prayer guide. Our prayer is that through your daily devotion time with Jesus the Holy Spirit will help you grow deeper in your faith and

strengthen your covenant relationship with God. Our Lenten Devotional will be available to pick up in person or you may scan the QR code to access on your phone.

Wednesday March 5 — Ash Wednesday Scripture Text: Luke 23:34 Statement From the Cross: "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."

Unsurprisingly, Jesus' first words from the cross were a prayer. What is surprising, almost disturbing, is what He prayed. "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." How can an innocent man, who was humiliated, nearly beaten to death, and facing death by crucifixion, intercede on behalf of those who are killing Him? But the bigger question that needs to be asked is, "who exactly was the "them" that Jesus was asking God to forgive?"

Wednesday March 12 Scripture Text: Luke 23:43 Statement From the Cross: "Today, you will be with Me in paradise."

It is said that a person is known by the company her or she keeps. In life and death, Jesus associated with sinners. This troubled the religious people, who often grumbled about it. Yet, at the core, this is who Jesus is: a friend of sinners. He welcomes people to come to Him, to be with Him, just as He welcomed the thief on the cross to join Him in paradise.

Wednesday March 19 Scripture Text: John 19:26-27

Statement From the Cross: "Woman, behold your son" and to John: "behold your mother."

No mother should ever have to watch her son die the agonizing death of crucifixion. In Jesus' third word from the cross, He spoke to His mother and closest disciple. This moment captures the heart of Jesus' mission, sacrificing love and giving of oneself to care for another. In His moment of death, Jesus turns His attention to His mother's welfare and sets the mark for the Christian church, serving and caring for others through Jesus' sacrifice.

Statement From the Cross: "My God, My God, why have you forsaken Me?"

For many, this is the most moving, disturbing, and powerfully haunting statement of the seven: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" These words not only reflect the darkness of this horrific experience Jesus endured but also the darkness within those who surrounded the cross. Yet, these words from the Psalmist point to a deeper faith that sustained Him on the cross.

Wednesday April 2 Scripture Text: John 19:28 Statement From the Cross: "I Thirst."

In the final moments on the cross, Jesus said two words that reveal His full humanity: "I thirst." As Jesus suffered on the cross for our sins, He cried out in pain, He thirsted as we thirst, and then He died as we die. Jesus did not circumvent His suffering nor His death for our sins.



Victory Forward: Expanding God's Kingdom in the East Valley

Dear Victory Church Family,

God is moving in powerful ways at Victory Lutheran Church, and we sense He is leading us to bold new steps in our mission locally. For nearly 48 years, we have joyfully proclaimed God's Word, offered traditional worship and historic Lutheran liturgy, and built a loving community where disciples of Jesus can grow and flourish. Three years ago, we captured our vision:

Victory Lutheran Church is a joyful and loving community that transforms and deploys Christ-centered disciples who lead others into God's mission frontiers, empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Planting new churches has always been part of our DNA. Victory was a started as a church plant back in 1997. In 2009, we started Christ the Victor in Florence, and in 2016, we began Victory Crismon. Now, after prayerful discernment, our leaders believe it's time to expand again. We are thrilled to announce "Victory Forward," an initiative to establish new church sites in the East Valley and metro Phoenix so more people can hear the Gospel and grow in Christ.

We are aiming high: by 2030, we hope to double the number of disciples who call Victory home, with one church in three locations. Our first milestone is to launch a new church site by Victory's 50th anniversary — April 3, 2027. We are also trusting God to help us start a third site by 2030. We recognize these are big goals — only the Lord can make them a reality! Yet, our current campus has limited room for growth, so expanding to new locations will help us welcome and disciple more people.

To Get Started:

We need to raise \$50,000 before Easter. These funds will help us plan and discern key questions: Who will lead this new mission? Where should we plant? When is the right time? How can we make the greatest impact for Christ? Crucially, this \$50,000 will allow us to bring in expertise and experience from those who have successfully done this in the past, ensuring we follow best practices and proven strategies, working closely with Victory's leadership to maintain a unified vision and direction for this new mission. Victory's Foundation has already committed \$10,000, and now we invite every member to prayerfully join us in this effort. Your gift — above and beyond regular tithes and offerings — will help us take these initial steps toward God's next mission frontier locally.

Will you partner with us through prayer, discernment, and giving? Ask the Lord how He wants you to support "Victory Forward." Together, we can continue growing as disciples of Jesus while leading others to discover His saving grace — even if the next mission field is right around the corner. We look forward to watching God work among us, for His glory and the advance of His Kingdom.
