CONGREGATIONAL MEETING TO CALL RENEE BENNETT SUN, APRIL 6, 2025, 12:30PM

You recently received a letter from Andrew Lund, VLC Council President, about the upcoming special congregation meeting on April 6 to call Renee Bennett as our Discipleship Pastor. I wish to share my own thoughts to emphasize the importance of this call and explain how it aligns with our church strategy.

Role of a Discipleship Pastor

A Discipleship Pastor supports individuals in

their spiritual growth by coordinating Bible studies, small groups, and spiritual formation activities. This role ensures everyone feels welcomed and nurtured in their walk with Christ. It also involves mentoring new leaders, encouraging volunteer involvement, and creating a welcoming community for anyone eager to grow in faith. At Victory, this position is designed to meet our congregation's needs by fostering meaningful, gospel-centered relationships.

Clarifying the Pastor Positions

Although it may seem like we're adding a new full-time pastoral role, the Discipleship Pastor position is actually half-time. It has already been part of our budget and ministry plan, and has been faithfully filled by Renee Bennett since last year. She will continue serving part-time, but now as an ordained pastor. Our call to her is simply a formal affirmation of her pastoral ministry among us and a step in requesting her Ordination with LCMC (our network of congregations).

Funding and Budget

There may be concerns about funding, especially with varying attendance throughout the year. Please be assured that all pastoral positions—full-time and half-time—are factored into the budget approved at our annual meeting. Our leadership carefully manages resources, balancing current needs and future ministry opportunities with the realities of changing attendance and giving patterns.

Historical Staffing Levels

Our strategy remains consistent with what was affirmed last fall at both the special congregational meeting to call Denton Bennet as our Associate Pastor, and at the annual meeting last fall. This is an investment in God's Kingdom that aligns with both our current plan and our history. In the years before the pandemic, Victory Church had four or five pastors on staff at once. In 2017, there were five; from 2018 to 2021, there were four—costing us more than we are spending this year. Having multiple pastors dedicated to different ministry areas (worship, preaching, discipleship, mission, outreach, and pastoral care) is not new for our congregation.

Investing in a Growing Future

By formally calling and affirming pastors who focus on various aspects of ministry, we hope to serve our congregation year-round and continue growing. Our prayer is that this plan will help more people come to know Jesus Christ as their Savior, and feel supported and welcomed at Victory. This is how we live out our shared mission: to serve and glorify God by being and making disciples of Jesus Christ.

Our Ongoing Commitment

Our goal is to make Victory a place where everyone feels spiritually supported, whether they live here year-round or join us during the busy winter months. The Church Council welcomes your questions and suggestions, and we truly value these conversations. Open communication and collaboration strengthen our shared ministry. I hope this message clarifies how this call to Renee Bennett fits into our overall strategy. Your commitment to Victory and your passion for helping us thrive together are a true blessing.

April 12-13, 2025 — Surrendered and Saved - 1 Peter 1:10-12

The prophets yearned for the day when Christ's work on the cross completed the mission of salvation, securing victory over sin and

death for all believers. Christ's death on the cross fulfilled every promise, accomplishing our rescue once and for all. This is the good news of a new life: surrendered hearts, saved souls, and the unshakeable hope that the prophets eagerly anticipated—and that we now get to enjoy!

April 19-20, 2025 — Victory Rising — Matthew 28:1-10

Jesus' resurrection proclaims His ultimate victory over sin and death, proving that despair never has the final word. The empty tomb shows God's plan to bring hope, new life, and freedom to all who trust in Christ. In response, we are called to embrace this transformative news personally and share the hope of the risen Savior with the world.

April 26-27, 2025 — Touching Truth — John 20:24-29

Thomas struggled to believe until he could touch Jesus's wounds, acknowledging how normal it is for our faith to waver when confronted with doubt or uncertainty. God has provided ample evidence of His love

and power through Christ's resurrection and the witness of Scripture, the Church, and our own experiences of grace. Rather than continually seeking more proof, accept what we have been shown, resting in the trust that the Risen Christ stands ready to meet us in our honest questions and lead us into deeper faith.

Lenten Series: FINAL WORDS — Eternal Impact

Wednesday, April 2 — Scripture Text: John 19:28 Statement From the Cross: "I Thirst."

In the final moments on the cross, Jesus said two words that reveal His full humanity: "I thirst." As Jesus suffered on the cross for our sins, He cried out in pain, He thirsted as we thirst, and then He died as we die. Jesus did not circumvent His suffering nor His death for our sins.

Wednesday, April 9 — Scripture Text: John 19:30 & Luke 23:46 Statement From the Cross: "It is Finished; Into Your hands I commend My Spirit."

"It is Finished!" What, exactly, is finished? The final words from Jesus are shouted, an exclamation of more than a final breath, but the final moment of salvation is completed. At this moment, the climax was reached, and His glory was revealed as He laid down His life to save humanity.

From Final Words to Eternal Impact

Join with the Victory community as we traverse the finals days of Christ's passion. It begins on Palm Sunday as we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem and concludes with the joyous celebration of His resurrection

on Easter morning! But during Holy Week we take time to pause and meditate on the final days and final words of Jesus' earthly life.

PALM SUNDAY is a time to wave your palm branches and shout "Hosanna" as we celebrate with the throngs of believers that our King has come! This weekend is focused around how Jesus is the fulfillment of prophecy, and yet, on this joyous day, the crowds do not understand that the story does not end with a joyful procession.

MAUNDY THURSDAY we gather to remember the profound rescue of our souls, when Jesus reinterprets the Passover as His Last Supper and calls his disciples to "Do this in remembrance of me." We will come together in heartfelt worship and reflection, recalling the incredible truth of God's enduring love and salvation through Christ. At our 6pm service, we are especially excited to witness a beautiful milestone as some of our children experience their First Communion—a tender reminder of new beginnings and the grace that unites us all. At the end of the service the altar will be stripped even as the life was stripped from Jesus.

GOOD FRIDAY is a beautiful tenebrae service of music and word. Tenebrae means darkness, and this is the last day that we meditate on Jesus' final hours on earth. Focused around the Seven Last Words that Jesus spoke, this powerful service includes readings, times of introspection, special music from the choir and soloists, as well as hymns and songs for the congregation to join. The extinguishing of candles is a visual reminder of Jesus' impending death. An opportunity to place a nail in the cross concludes this somber yet meaningful service.


STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be open on both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday in the Fellowship Hall. From 3-8pm these interactive stations will be available for your personal devotional time, and include scripture, reflections and interactive ways for you to meditate on the sacrifice Jesus made for you.

SUNRISE: He is risen, indeed! A meaningful tradition at Victory includes our special Sunrise service outdoors at 6am. Celebrating the resurrection as the run rises, this unique service includes communion, a special visit from the women at the tomb as shared by our pastoral team, and music provided by our Handbell Ensemble. There will be a continental breakfast in the Fellowship Hall from 6:45 to 7:45am and all are invited!

EASTER: After a long week of contemplating the pain and suffering Jesus went through for us, we get to celebrate that the empty tomb shows God's plan to bring hope, new life, and freedom to all who trust in Christ.! Our lead pastor will be preaching from Matthew 28, and the Traditional Easter services include soloists, choir and brass on Saturday 4pm, Sunday 8am & 9:30am. If you could use extra time to park or want to get a better seat, the 8am service will be exactly the same as 9:30am. Contemporary worship and Children's Church is at 11am.

Dear Victory Church Family,

Every church family experiences seasons of dynamic growth and other times when our momentum slows. In those quieter moments, it's tempting to rely on what worked in the past rather than stepping out in faith for the future. Recently, the news of a couple of local churches struggling with decline struck a somber chord, reminding us that no congregation is immune to life's natural cycles. Our own attendance trends over the years reflect this pattern, with a vibrant peak and then some dips: from a high of 807 in 2009 to a more recent number of 633 in 2024.

Yet God continually invites us into fresh beginnings. A tested and tried life cycle for churches and organizations, called the Sigmoid Curve, describes how organizations grow, peak, and often decline like a bell curve. The core challenge is discerning the right time to launch a new ministry "curve." The best moment to shift gears is before momentum fades, when there is still abundant energy and resources to explore where the Holy Spirit might be leading. If we wait until we have hit our lowest point, we will have fewer avenues and more obstacles. So what might happen if we don't do this? We risk slipping into maintenance mode, settling for past accomplishments, and eventually facing deeper decline. In those times, the spark that once fired our mission can burn low, and we may find ourselves merely preserving traditions rather than embracing God's call to mission and growth.

Scripture encourages us to step forward with courage. In 1 Chronicles 12:32, the tribe of Issachar "understood the signs of the times and knew the best course for Israel to take." Like Issachar, we must recognize our moment and respond faithfully. If we don't, complacency can rob us of God's unfolding purposes. But what might happen if we do step out in faith with *Victory Forward*? We unleash new possibilities for ministry, strengthen our congregation's impact, and reaffirm our trust in God's promise to guide us. We open ourselves to greater capacity for outreach, forging deeper community partnerships, and equipping future generations to continue the mission we hold dear.

I celebrate the ways our congregation has already chosen a posture of growth. We have a staff rich in talent and passion, a testament to God's ongoing work among us. *Victory Forward*, our initiative to prepare the next new church mission site in the East Valley, is both exciting and necessary. It is our invitation to join in a renewed vision for serving those around us. This first phase is about discernment—seeking God's voice together, listening for His direction, and envisioning how we can bring Jesus' hope to more people and families.

We stand at a crucial crossroads: we can settle for the status quo or follow the Spirit into fresh opportunities. As your Lead Pastor, I thank our Council for putting forth this bold direction. In prayerful expectation, I invite each of you to dream alongside us, to pray fervently, and to offer your gifts and insights. May we follow the Tribe of Issachar's example, understanding the times and taking the best course for God's work among us.

The choice is clear: remain where we are, or let God ignite something new and beautiful. By pursuing *Victory Forward* in faith, we honor the legacy we've inherited and ensure that our congregation stands ready to bless tomorrow's generation. Together, let us trust in the One who has led us thus far, believing He will be faithful still.



NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER WORSHIP SERVICE Thursday, May 1 @ 10:00am

Because of the faith of many of our founding fathers, public prayer and national days of prayer have a long-standing and significant history in American tradition. This tradition will continue this year, on Thursday May 1st at 10:00 a.m. as Victory Lutheran Church joins other congregations and communities from around our great nation in the 73rd observance of the National Day of Prayer.

This year the theme for the National Day of Prayer comes from Romans 15:13 that reads, "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (NASB)

As you may know, the National Day of Prayer is a vital part of our heritage. Since the first call to prayer in 1775, when the Continental Congress asked the colonies to pray for wisdom in forming a nation, the call to prayer has continued through our history, including President Lincoln's proclamation of a day of "humiliation, fasting, and prayer" in 1863. In 1952, a joint resolution by Congress, signed by President Truman, declared an annual national day of prayer. In 1988, the law was amended and signed by President Reagan, permanently setting the day as the first Thursday of every May. Each year, the president signs a proclamation, encouraging all Americans to pray on this day.

The National Day of Prayer continues to have great significance for us as a nation as it enables us to recall and to teach the way in which our founding fathers sought the wisdom of God when faced with critical decisions. It stands as a call for us to humbly come before God, seeking His guidance for our leaders and His grace upon us as a people.

Please plan to join us at 10:00am in the courtyard chapel as we gather to seek God's will for our nation, our communities, and our church family here at Victory Lutheran.

We will be handing out a special themed prayer guide the weekend of April 26-27 to guide us as we pray together as a community in Christ.
