#### Opener:

Where were you when you heard that President John F. Kennedy was shot?

### Go Deeper:

- 1. What emotions do you hear in Thomas's
- 2. How do these verses describe faith from two different angles—both "seeing" and "not
- 3. The first word Jesus speaks is "Peace." Scan Isaiah 26:3 and Philippians 4:7. Why is peace the doorway to deeper faith?
- 4. Jesus invites Thomas to examine His wounds. How do the scars of Christ answer both intellectual questions and emotional pain? (See 1 Peter 2:24)
- 5. Read 1 Peter 1:3-9. Peter calls our inheritance "imperishable." Which words in this passage give you the most hope when your world shakes?

#### Live It:

- 1. Which of these two ways are you prone to respond when life gets difficult: mad at God, sad with life?
- 2. Healthy doubt asks honest questions. What are some "healthy doubt" questions you have heard?
- 3. What question about God have you been afraid to voice, and who is a safe believer you can ask this week?
- 4. Think of one person you know facing a locked-door season—illness, layoff, grief. What practical act or word of peace can you offer in the next 72 hours?




