# SET APART FOR THE SAKE OF THE GOSPEL Celebrating the Ordination of Renee Bennett

While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." (Acts 13:2)

Every so often, the Holy Spirit nudges the Church to press "pause," lift its collective head, and marvel at what God is doing in one of His servants. Ordination is one of those holy pauses. It is the Church's public recognition that the Lord Himself has called, gifted, and set apart a sister or brother to proclaim the Gospel and shepherd His people.

#### WHAT ORDINATION MEANS

- 1. A Divine Call Confirmed by the Church: Paul reminded Timothy, "Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you ... when the council of elders laid their hands on you." (1 Tim. 4:14) The laying on of hands is more than ceremony; it is the visible "Amen" of Christ's Body to God's invisible call.
- A Lifelong Vocation: Ordination is not merely a milestone on a resume; it is a life-long "yes" to Jesus' claim on one's heart and voice. "Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel!" (1 Cor. 9:16) From this day forward, Renee will carry the joyful burden of that verse.
- 3. **An Act of Stewardship:** The Church entrusts Word and Sacrament to an ordained pastor so that Christ's flock is fed and protected. "Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock ... be shepherds of the Church of God." (Acts 20:28)

#### Ordination and Renee's Role

On May 18th we will ordain Renee Bennett—and we could not be more grateful! Ordination marks her identity as a preacher of Christ's good news wherever God may send her throughout her life. Her position as Discipleship Pastor at Victory, however, is a particular assignment for this season: guiding small-group ministries, shaping spiritual formation, and helping every generation grow deep roots in Jesus. Roles can change; the call to proclaim the Gospel remains.

#### **Our Shared Privilege**

# **MAY SERMON SERIES: EYEWITNESS NEWS**

**Eyewitness News** invites us into the stories of those who encountered the risen Jesus firsthand—confused travelers, a restored disciple, a doubting community, and a watching world. Throughout May, we will relive these powerful moments from Scripture, where Jesus revealed Himself in bread and fire, through forgiveness and mission, and ultimately through His ascension. Their eyewitness accounts remind us that Jesus still walks with us, still sends us, and still calls us to be His witnesses today.

### May 3-4, 2025 — Walk to Emmaus - Luke 24:13–35

On the road to Emmaus, Jesus opened the Scriptures and broke bread—two powerful ways He revealed Himself to His followers. While eyewitness accounts of the resurrection are compelling, Jesus shows us that the written Word has always carried the promise: that He would suffer, rise, and redeem. Through the table of Communion and the testimony of prophecy, we discover a Savior who is not only risen but also walking with us even now.

# May 10-11, 2025 — Seen & Sent - John 21:15-19

In the glow of a charcoal fire, Peter is not condemned for his

failure but lovingly restored by the risen Jesus, who sees through the shame and speaks directly to his heart. With compassion and forgiveness, Jesus doesn't just welcome Peter back—He entrusts him with a mission: "Feed my sheep." When we bring our confession to Christ, we don't find rejection—we find restoration, and a calling to care for others with the same love we have received.

# May 17-18, 2025 — The Mission Still Stands — Matthew 28:16–20

Even among the very first disciples—eyewitnesses to the risen Jesus—some worshiped and some doubted. Yet Jesus doesn't rebuke their hesitation; He sends them anyway, calling them to go, teach, and remember that He is always with them. This weekend, Pastor Brian LaMew—who serves with our global partner Orchard: Africa and now joins us in our *Victory Forward* local mission—will remind us that even when we wrestle with doubt, God still calls us to obedient action, anchored in the memory of His promises and presence.

#### May 24-25, 2025 — He Left So We Could Go — Acts 1:1-11

As Jesus ascends into heaven, the disciples are left staring skyward—stunned, uncertain, yet promised power from on high. This moment is not the end, but the launching point of a mission that stretches from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth, carried by the same Spirit Jesus promised would come. Discover how Jesus' ascension not only fulfills ancient prophecies but also calls us—right here and now—to be His witnesses in a world still in need of hope.

Dear Victory Church Family,

I was in the garage last week, wading through boxes I once deemed "essential." Somewhere between my seminary notebooks and a battered baseball glove, the Spirit whispered, "Todd, you can't take any of this with you." Jesus said it first—and better:

"Use worldly wealth to make friends for yourselves, so that when it is gone, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings." (Luke 16:9)

In other words, earthly resources are temporary tools for an eternal mission. We either watch them fade—or invest them in people who will greet us on the other side of glory. That's the heartbeat of *Victory Forward*.

# Why the East Valley?

Drive through East Mesa, Apache Junction, Gilbert, or Queen Creek, and you'll see neighborhoods spring up where desert once stood. # **What Could Happen Next?**

Your gift hasn't finished anything; it has ignited everything. Picture what God might do as we keep stepping forward together:

- **Imagine** a single mom in Queen Creek who, months from now, stumbles into a new Victory site and discovers a church family ready to bring groceries, grace, and the gospel.
- **Picture** a high-schooler in East Mesa who could trade Friday-night trouble for a Friday-night youth group—because you helped rent the storefront where students will gather.
- **Envision** a retiree who might find fresh purpose mentoring young dads at a coffee-and-Bible study we have yet to launch, but is already on God's calendar.

None of those scenes exist yet, but they are waiting on the other side of our obedience—and God's limitless power.

# How We Move the Kingdom Line Forward

- 1. **Pray Expectantly.** Ask the Holy Spirit to guide every decision as we steward that first \$50K and seek the next steps.
- 2. **Give Generously.** Each additional gift is a brick in the house the Lord is building.
- 3. **Go Willingly.** When the call comes to serve, launch, or simply greet, let's be ready to say, "Here am I—send me."

The treasures in our garages and the balances in our bank accounts won't follow us past the grave. But the neighbors who meet Jesus because we invested will welcome us into "eternal dwellings." That is the promise of Luke 16, and it is the pulse of *Victory Forward*.

I'm all in, and I'm grateful you are too. Let's keep sending it ahead—together.

# HAVE YOU TRIED A SMALL GROUP YET?

Life is full of choices. Every day, you must make countless decisions. Some seem very unimportant and are needed just to get through the day. Some have a far more meaningful and lasting impact. Your attitude towards each choice is as important, if not more important. Peter faced many choices. Some were good, some were not. When Christ was under arrest, Peter made a poor decision and denied Christ three times. In John 21, Peter made a good choice and accepted the call to ministry by reiterating three times that he loved Christ and loved what He loved. Attitude, how he handled the situation, played a big part in Peter's legacy and its effect on others. Peter and Judas both betrayed Jesus at one point. However, the way Peter handled his denial of Christ and the way Judas handled his denial of Christ produced two completely different situations.

Peter repented, served Christ, and helped birth the church. Judas's sorrow led him to hang himself. How do you handle choices and with what attitude? It all comes down to which basin will you go to? As a disciple of Jesus Christ, you have two basins you can choose from in your walk with Christ. One is found in Matthew 27:24, and the other in John 13:5.

In Matthew 27:24, Pontius Pilate uses the basin to excuse himself of the matter at hand. He turns in frustration and walks away from the decision, refusing to spend more time than was required on Jesus. He does what is easy, not what is right. In contrast, in John 13, Jesus uses the basin to model servant leadership in the life of a disciple. He had an attitude of serving. At a time when the disciples were fighting for status and positioning, Jesus showed what mattered. He did what was right, not what was easy.

So, in your walk with Jesus as His disciple, your family, and your situations in life, which basin do you go to? As we walk from the empty tomb during

# CHILDREN'S FIRST COMMUNION

On Maundy Thursday we celebrated the First Communion of six of our children: Jayce Cervantes, Gracelyn Murillo, Ruby Wilson, Maverick Wilson, Kobe Wilson, and Tytus Lee. What a wonderful witness these children were to God's promise of forgiveness found in His body and blood. Receiving their First Communion on the celebration of the Last Supper was very meaningful to them. This Passover meal that we call the Last Supper was the night that Jesus broke bread with His closest friends and explained that the bread was His body and the cup of wine was the New Covenant in His blood, shed for the forgiveness of all of our sins.

In order to be ready to receive their First Communion, these children along with their parents attended a First communion class where they learned that the Lord's Supper gives us the promise through the earthly elements of bread and wine that our sins are forgiven and that we are the passive recipients of God's forgiveness. We do nothing to deserve this. It's Christ's words that through His body and blood our sins are forgiven, that makes it so. Our faith and our conduct have nothing to do with the efficacy of the sacrament.

Please continue to pray for these children and all of our young ones here at Victory. Pray that God continues to bless us with His children as we faithfully follow His guidance in leading our Children's Church, First Communion classes and Confirmation.
