### "Failing Forward" — Exodus 2:11-25

Moses' failure in Egypt didn't disqualify him—it prepared him. In the quiet obscurity of the desert, God reshaped a self-reliant prince into a humble servant, teaching him to rest, wait, and rely on divine timing. As Psalm 119:67,71 reminds us, sometimes failure is the only classroom where obedience and intimacy with God are truly learned.

### July 12-13, 2025

### "Take My Hand" — Exodus 2:21-22, 3:1

Moses' forty years in the desert weren't wasted—they were where God peeled away every title and comfort, and formed in him a heart ready to hear, trust, and obey. The wilderness became a sacred classroom where God taught Moses, and teaches us, to stop clinging to the past and start walking in childlike faith toward an unknown future. So when your dreams turn to dust and your courage fades, listen for God's voice saying,"Take My hand and walk where I lead—keep your eyes on Me alone."

#### July 19-20, 2025

### "Qualified by Failure" — Exodus 3:1-10

Moses thought his story was over—washed up in Midian with nothing to offer but regret and routine. But on an ordinary day in an ordinary place, God lit a bush and reignited a calling, proving that failure doesn't disqualify you—it qualifies you. The God who shows up in burning bushes still speaks through His Word and still calls broken people to do beautiful things.

# "Who Me, Lord?" - Exodus 3:10-4:19




# SUNDAY MORNING REFRESHMENTS SUMMER HOURS

Dear Victory Family,

I am asking you to do something big. Not flashy or loud—but spiritually deep, humble, and vital: to pray. From July 21–23, a group of leaders from across our church will gather for a three-day prayer and vision retreat right here in Mesa. Our purpose? To seek God's wisdom and guidance as we ask this question together: **Lord, how are You calling Victory to extend Your Kingdom in the East Valley?** 

We recognize that faithful vision requires faithful planning. That's why we're not doing this alone. We've invited a trust leader who has already planted vibrant churches right here in the East Valley —Pastor Brian LaMew—who has walked this road before, made mistakes, witnessed miracles, and grown communities of faith. We'll listen to one another, attentive to God's voice, and, Lord willing, discover Divine direction. And, most importantly, we will pray.

Proverbs gives us this powerful insight:

"Without counsel plans fail, but with many advisers they succeed." (Proverbs 15:22)
"Where there is no guidance, a people falls, but in an abundance of counselors there is safety."

(Proverbs 11:14)

God's design has always involved people—His people—coming together to discern, to wrestle, to plan, and to follow where He leads. That's what this retreat is all about. And we need your prayers.

Would you join us in asking God to meet us during these days? We long for clarity and courage so that—like the early church leaders in Acts 15—we might say with conviction, "It seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us..." (Acts 15:28).

Why does this matter? Because there are thousands of people across the East Valley—and beyond —who are longing for what you and I sometimes take for granted: peace with God, the joy of worship, a loving church family, a sense of purpose and belonging. Most don't even know what they're missing. But Jesus does. And He's calling us—Victory Lutheran Church—to go.

That's what *Victory Forward* is all about. Not programs. Not buildings. But **planting new ministry sites, raising up new leaders, and reaching new hearts**—all so more people can experience the grace and truth of Jesus Christ.

We are not charging ahead with our own ideas. We are pausing to pray. We are seeking the Lord. We are asking Him to move before we do. So, would you pray with us? Pray for your church. Pray for our leaders. Pray that we would listen carefully, follow faithfully, and step forward boldly.

We are not just dreaming. We are discerning. We are not just building. We are believing. We are not just talking about the future. We are asking God to lead us into it.

#### SHAKE UP YOUR SMALL GROUP MEETINGS

#### Adopted from an article called "Shake It Up!" By Mark Ingmire

If your small-group meetings have become routine, it may be time to shake things up. The good news is that it doesn't take dramatic ideas to energize your group—simple changes can make a big difference.

#### **CHANGE THE MEETING LOCATION**

Meet in a different group member's home, a park, or even a restaurant. Some of the best group memories come from suspending study time and carpooling to a nearby ice cream shop to share stories and enjoy each other's company. Going to a new destination

enables group members to gain fresh perspectives of one another.

Consider these alternate meeting locations:

- Coffee shop or ice cream parlor
- Public park, beach, or lakeshore
- \* Restaurant or mall food court
- Church auditorium or sanctuary
- Neighborhood clubhouse
- Another group member's home
   \*Remember to consider childcare needs when changing locations.



#### **INCORPORATE GROUP ACTIVITIES**

Lesson Application as a Group Project: Instead of just asking

"What am I going to do?" wrap up your lesson by asking "What are we as a group going to do?" Develop a group project like serving at a care home, hosting a neighborhood cookout, or helping a fellow group member. When you apply what you've learned together, you'll develop unity and group identity.

**Media Discussion:** Watch a movie and discuss it in light of Scripture. This might take longer than a typical meeting, so plan for a separate day or break it into two parts. You can also use short TV or movie clips to set up your lesson.

#### **CHANGE THE AGENDA**

When every meeting looks exactly the same, it's easy to get stuck in a rut. Mix things up with these ideas:

**Celebrate the Lord's Supper:** This works anytime but is especially meaningful during Easter and Christmas seasons. Small groups have been celebrating communion since the beginning of the church (Acts 2:46). Make it meaningful by teaching about the Lord's Supper using Scripture, incorporating music, or spending time in prayer.

**Introduce Worship:** Bring your iPod or worship CD and choose familiar songs. Make copies of lyrics for everyone. Consider songs from weekend services or Christian radio. God isn't concerned about how perfect your singing voice is—He cares about your heart.

**Let Someone Else Lead:** Ask a group member who participates well to facilitate a lesson. Choose someone who shares helpful, thoughtful comments without preaching from a soapbox. Keep the same agenda but allow them to design the lesson and lead discussion. You might discover a future leader through this process.

#### THE BOTTOM LINE

All small groups need a little shake-up once in a while. Simple adjustments can help group members grow spiritually and deepen their relationships with one another. Try shaking up your group this week—you will see increased participation, excitement, and energy.


