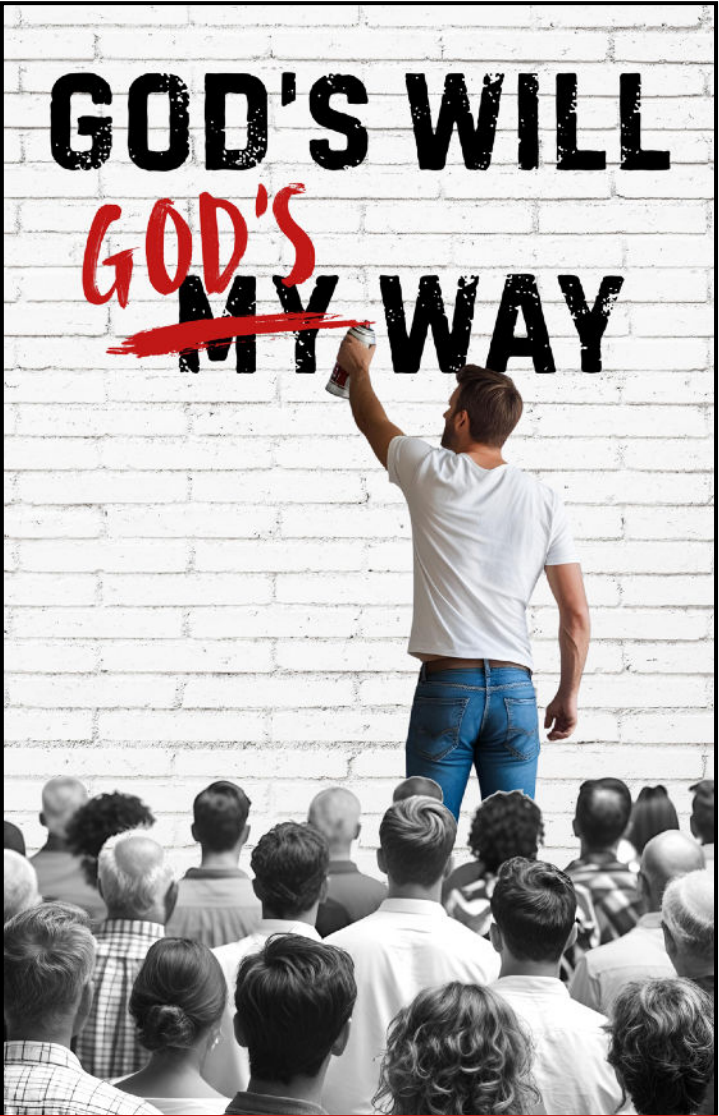

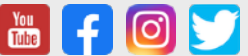

God's Will, God's Way #8:
"God's Will, God's Way"
Exodus 4:17-23, 27-31

Opener:
Identify something you carry with you every day.

Go Deeper:
(Exploring the Bible)

- Exodus 4:20** – Why do you think Scripture emphasizes that Moses took "the staff of God" in his hand? What does this tell us about how God uses ordinary things in extraordinary ways?
- 2 Corinthians 12:9** – What does Paul mean when he says God's "power is made perfect in weakness"? How does that truth apply to Moses—and to you?
- Exodus 4:22-23** – Why does God call Israel His "firstborn son"? How does that deepen your understanding of His mission to deliver His people?
- Ephesians 1:4-5** – What does it mean that God chose and predestined us before the creation of the world? How does this verse connect to God's call on Moses?

Live It:
(Applying to Our Lives)

- Moses had his staff. What's your "staff"? What ordinary gift, resource, or opportunity has God placed in your life that He could use for His glory?

- Are you currently resisting something God is calling you to do—perhaps because you don't feel strong or ready? What would it look like to step forward in faith, trusting in His strength?
- In what situation do you most need to remember that God is present with you right now?
- Where do you feel "unqualified" in your faith life—witnessing, parenting, leading, serving? What if God is planning to display His power through your weakness?

GO TIME: S.A.F.E. Event — Feed My Starving Children

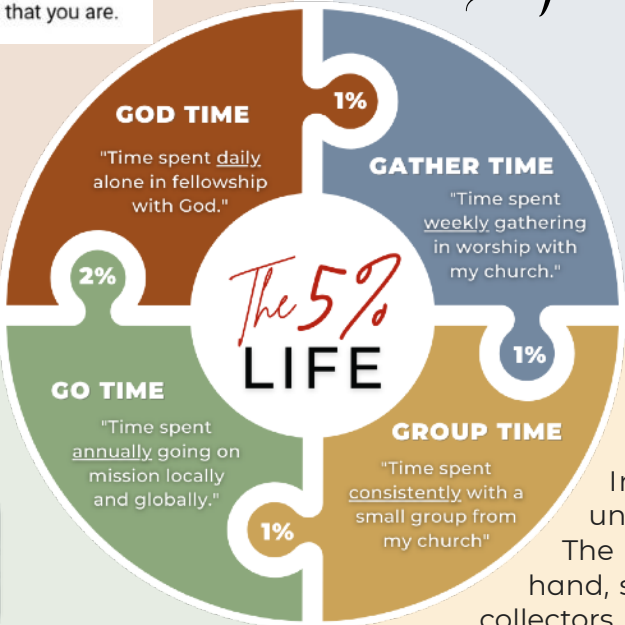
In just two hours, you can help turn hunger into hope by volunteering at Feed My Starving Children (FMSC). As a Christian organization, FMSC is driven by the mission to glorify Jesus through feeding children who are hungry—both physically and spiritually.

Volunteers hand-pack nutritious MannaPack™ meals—rice, soy, vegetables, and essential vitamins—that are shipped to schools, orphanages, clinics, and feeding programs in over 70 countries. These meals provide daily hope to children facing severe food insecurity. In the 8 neediest countries alone, of the 70 served, there were nearly 72 million hungry children last year..

FMSC's impact is made possible by people like YOU. Since our Singles group began monthly service trips, 30 different volunteers have stepped up. You don't have to go every month—but summer is when help is needed most. Hunger doesn't take a vacation. This is our only "Give Back" event, and we want to grow our team. **Our goal is 10 volunteers each month**—we've averaged 6 so far. **Join us on the fourth Wednesday of each month.** The bus leaves at 8:00am; packing takes place from 9:00-11:00am. Good news—the bus is now free. Let's serve with joy and purpose—sign up at the lobby table!

GROUP TIME: Leadership Looks Like This . . .

We watched this last week.

In The Chosen, Season 5, Episode 7, the scene is unforgettable — Jesus kneels to wash the feet of His disciples. The room falls quiet, awkward. The King of Kings, towel in hand, scrubs dust and grime from the feet of fishermen and tax collectors. This is not how leaders behave...or is it?

Jesus redefines leadership — not as authority or applause, but as humble service. "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so," He says. "Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet" (John 13:13–14). And then He seals it with a promise: "Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them" (v17).

Leadership in the Kingdom of God looks like bending low to lift others up. It looks like popcorn and coffee, made with love each morning before we watch The Chosen together. It looks like unseen hands who serve so others can be fed — physically, emotionally, spiritually.

Those acts may seem small, but they embody something sacred. The ones who serve behind the scenes are showing us what real discipleship looks like. Jesus isn't looking for fans — He's forming followers who lead by serving.

So today, where is Jesus calling you to lead? Who can you bless — not by directing, but by doing?

Because in God's Kingdom, the ones who bend low are the ones who rise up with joy. And Jesus promises: You'll be blessed if you do.
