## God's Will, God's Way #6: "Qualified by Failure"

Exodus 3:1-10

### Opener:

Briefly share a physical injury from which you have never fully recovered.

### Go Deeper:

(Exploring the Bible)

- 1. What's the significance of God choosing to reveal Himself in such an ordinary place and moment?
- 2. What happened only after Moses turned aside to look? How might this shape our understanding of how God invites, rather than forces, us to hear His voice?
- 3. How do God's words reflect His heart for His people? What stands out to you in His response to suffering?
- 4. How had Moses previously tried to step into his calling? Why did it fail?
- 5. Read Romans 8:11 and Hebrews 4:15–16. What do these passages say about how God empowers us today—even in failure? What kind of confidence can we have?

### Live It:

(Applying to Our Lives)

- 1. Where in your life do you feel stuck in the wilderness—forgotten, routine, or burned
- 2. What "burning bush" moment might God be using to get your attention right now? Is there a nudge, discomfort, or situation you've been tempted to ignore?
- 3. Is there a failure in your past that you believe disqualifies you? What might it look like to see it instead as a training ground?
- 4. How might you make space to "turn aside" this week—to listen, reflect, and invite God to speak?
- 5. God doesn't ask for perfection—but for willingness. What would a simple "Here I am, Lord" response look like for you?



## **GOD TIME: How to Hear God Speak Pastor Todd Mathison**

If every voice in your head claimed to be from God, how would you know which one to trust?

We have all wished God would just spell it out—write it in the sky, thunder it from heaven: take this job, marry that person, wait for that door to open. So how does God actually speak to us today?

Jesus answered that question in John 16:13: "But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth." The Holy Spirit has come—poured out at

Pentecost—and He lives in every baptized believer. But how do we know what He's saying?


Let's be clear: the Holy Spirit does speak today. But not mainly through feelings or hunches. His clearest voice is found in the pages of Scripture. That's the foundation. If you want to hear from God, start by opening your Bible.


But what about decisions the Bible doesn't directly address? That's where the Spirit may also guide us personally—through prayer, through your heart, and through the wise counsel of others. The Bible says in Proverbs 11:14 (MSG): Without good direction, people lose their way; the more wise counsel you follow, the better your chances." And here's the key: check what you hear. Ask a trusted


Otherwise, we're in danger of mistaking our own wishes for God's will.
