Discovering God's Plan #5: "The Legacy of a Godly Life" Deuteronomy 34:1-12

Opener:

What would you like your tombstone to say?

Go Deeper: (Exploring the Bible)

1. Read Deuteronomy 34:1-12. What strikes you most about how Moses' life ends? What emotions do you imagine he felt on Mount Nebo?
2. Compare Deut 34:10 with Exodus 33:11. What does "face to face" communion with God suggest about prayer and faith?
3. Read 2 Corinthians 5:6-9. What gives Paul courage about death and daily living? How does this connect to Psalm 116:15 and John 5:24?
4. Read Numbers 20:7-13 and Deut 3:23-28. How did God deal with Moses' failure? What do you learn about God's justice and mercy?
5. Read Psalm 92:12-15. Identify the promises for "old age." Where do you see these in your life?

Live It: (Applying to Our Lives)

1. **Faithfulness:** What is your "Nebo" this week—a specific, small act of faith you can do? Name it and schedule it.
2. **Humility:** Who is a "Joshua" you can encourage or empower? Write the text, make the call, or extend the invitation.
3. **Retirement Phases:** If you are retired, which phase best describes you — Vacation, Loss, Trial & Error, or Reinvention? What's one Spirit-led next step to move toward Reinvention?
4. **Plant the Apple Tree:** Identify one "seed" you can plant this week—a visit, a note, a serving role, a mentoring coffee—that will bear fruit beyond you.
5. **Hope in Grief:** How do Job 19:25-27 and 2 Corinthians 5:8 comfort you regarding loved ones in Christ—and your own future?



GOD TIME: Reflections from the Luther-Bach Pilgrimage

Eighteen travelers connected to Victory Lutheran Church recently returned from an unforgettable twelve-day Luther-Bach Pilgrimage through Germany—a journey that beautifully intertwined faith, history, and music. From Munich to Leipzig to Berlin, the group traced the lives and legacies of two towering figures whose influence still shapes the theology and worship of Victory Lutheran Church today: reformer Martin Luther and composer Johann Sebastian Bach.

In Wittenberg, they stood before the Castle Church door where Luther posted his 95 Theses, igniting a movement that reawakened the Gospel of grace and forever changed the Church. At the Wartburg Castle in Eisenach, they reflected on his year of hidden solitude—a season of spiritual renewal that led to his translation of the New Testament into the language of the people. In Leipzig and Naumburg, the group listened to the sacred strains of Bach's music in the very spaces where he once directed choirs to the glory of God. Throughout the pilgrimage, travelers reflected on Luther's rediscovery of the Gospel and Bach's theology of beauty—each a living testimony that faith and art can proclaim the same eternal truth.

The journey also carried a sobering depth. Standing in silence at Dachau and at the Brandenburg Gate in Berlin on the 35th anniversary of German Unity Day, pilgrims were reminded that God's grace still breaks through humanity's darkest walls with light and hope. All returned home renewed—grateful to live and worship by the same Gospel cry: **Christ Alone, Grace Alone, Faith Alone, Word Alone.**


