Life Notes

Discovering God's Plan #4: "Does Anger Get the Best (Worst) Of You?" Numbers 20:1-13

Opener:

Why do you think it is so easy for us to lose our cool and fly off the handle?

Go Deeper: (Exploring the Bible)

1. Read Numbers 20:1-13. What sticks out to you about the situation Moses found himself in? (For example: no water, people gathered in opposition...) What was Moses' reaction?
2. Comparing what happened to Moses in Numbers 20 because of his rage with what James says in James 1:19-20 how different would the outcome for Moses have been if he was slow to anger?
3. Read Ephesians 4:26-27. What does Paul say can happen to us if we remain angry? What do you think it means to give the devil a foothold?
4. What does Proverbs 29:11 say is the outcome for those who vent their rage? Contrast this with Proverbs 17:27-28.
5. When is a time when anger is appropriate? Read Exodus 32:19-20. How is this different from the rage that Moses showed in Numbers 20?

Live It: (Applying to Our Lives)

1. Jesus got angry and cleansed the temple because the people were not honoring God's house. Are there times when our anger can actually be honoring to God? If yes, give some examples.
2. Moses was a faithful leader and yet he sinned and did not give God the Glory at Meribah. How does this punishment affect how you feel about leadership? Do you agree that leadership should be held to a higher standard? Why or why not? How forgiving are you of leadership when they sin?
3. God is the Rock of our Salvation. We all lose our tempers and need God's mercy and forgiveness. Who is God laying on your heart that you need to seek forgiveness from this week? Whom do you need to forgive?



Bill and Stan were two ordinary men who I discovered, were followers of an extraordinary God. God gave Bill and Stan to me as friends while we were all stationed at Altus Air Force Base in 1973-74 in southwest Oklahoma. Having just returned from a six-month temporary duty assignment in Thailand, I found myself in a small town set in the midst of wheat fields and ranches. I was lonely. But then God gave me the gift of two people who saw me and befriended me. They reached out to me. They invited me to hang out, to go to movies, to play softball, to go hiking and to go camping on the weekends.

Bill and Stan never gave me the sense that I was some target for their evangelistic efforts. They never tried to talk me into making a decision for Christ. They just enjoyed being with me and in that context over time, shared God's story and their God stories with me in all gentleness and respect.

Followers of Jesus Christ have stories to share. First and foremost, we have God's story to share; the story of what God has done for us that we can never do for ourselves through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. And along with God's story, He has given us our own God stories to share. Stories of how He has impacted our lives with His love and His power. Stories of how our experience of God's grace and forgiveness have healed and transformed our lives. God has given us stories to share and there is someone who needs to hear your God story and mine!
