Opener:

Go Deeper: (Exploring the Bible)

- Read Joshua 24:14–15. What competing "gods" were Israel tempted to serve?
- Why does Joshua rehearse God's faithfulness before calling for a decision?
- Read Matthew 6:19–24. What does Jesus teach about the relationship between treasure and the heart?
- Read Malachi 3:10 and 2 Corinthians 9:7–8. How do these passages complement each other?
- What "stones of remembrance" has God placed in your life?

Live It: (Applying to Our Lives)

- If someone asked your family, "What do these stones mean?" what story would your life tell?
- What step of allegiance—service, forgiveness, mission, or giving—is God calling you to take?
- What fears or hesitations hold you back from deeper generosity?
- How might choosing to tithe or increase giving reshape your trust in God?
- What legacy of faith do you want to leave for your children, grandchildren, or church family?

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GOD TIME: A Heart Full of Thanks

Dear Victory Family,

Thanksgiving isn't just a holiday—it's a posture of the heart. Paul's words in Ephesians remind us that gratitude begins not with our circumstances, but with the astonishing truth of what God has done for us: *"Long before he laid down earth's foundations, he had us in mind... decided to adopt us into his family... and wanted us to enter into the celebration of his lavish gift-giving."* (Ephesians 1:3–6, The Message)

Sit with that a moment. Before the first sunrise, God already knew you. Loved you. Chose you. Planned to call you His own through Jesus Christ. That means every blessing in your life—every breath, every sunrise, every act of grace—is tied to a deeper truth: **you are the focus of His love.**

There's a little story about a boy who prayed at dinner, "Dear God, thank You for this food—even though I don't like it very much." Honest. Simple. Grateful. And maybe a bit like us. Gratitude doesn't always come easy. Our world trains us to notice what we lack more than what we've been given. A recent Barna study found that while most Americans say they feel "blessed," less than half name God as the source. We've disconnected gratitude from its Giver.

But Scripture reconnects it. Thanksgiving, biblically, isn't a date—it's a way of seeing. It's remembering that everything we have flows from the extravagant generosity of God, who chose us, adopted us, redeemed us, and blesses us daily in Christ.

As you gather around your tables this week, may your heart whisper what your lips may or may not speak aloud: **"Thank You, Lord—for choosing me, for loving me, and for giving me everything in Jesus."**

Let's not just give thanks—let's live thankful.

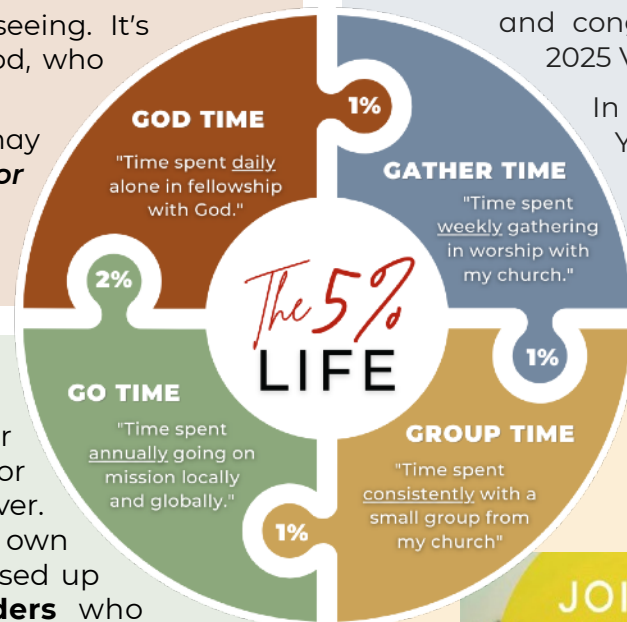

GROUP TIME: "Joining Jesus" — Living the Mission Where We Are

We had a wonderful time learning about spreading the word to those around us at the Joining Jesus classes. The videos, discussions, and readings left a positive impact on all of us. Check out what people had to say:



[The Joining Jesus Study] influenced my faith by challenging me to pray for neighbors I know and those I don't know. It reminded me that God has already "prepared" the good works of sharing Jesus or finding "people of peace". My daily prayer should be open to follow Jesus, and then have conversations with people. The truth that stood out to me is that Jesus' followers today have inherited the same commission Jesus gave His disciples, and that in our own "going". He goes with us. I need to act on this promise more intentionally. ~ Joe Myers

[Joining Jesus] makes the idea of evangelism something that everyone can do - we don't need to "go on a mission trip" - we have a mission field where we live - we just need to recognize it. The simplicity of just coming alongside someone - becoming friends - and seeing where Jesus is working. The idea [that came to me is] that the church is realizing that it needs to be doing "mission" differently. We need to change what we are doing because the church isn't the "social gathering place" it used to be 50 years ago. As a community we need to be looking for God's presence on a daily basis. ~ Anonymous

[Joining Jesus] made me more aware of opportunities to join Jesus on a "mission" trip. [I need to] open my eyes and ears to opportunities that have been around me for days, weeks, months, and years. ~ Denis Schneckloth
