### Discovering Life #1: Step Into The Journey Matthew 4:18-22

#### Opener:

When you hear the word "follow," do you think first of freedom...or of giving something up? Why?

#### Go Deeper: (Exploring the Bible)

1. If Jesus said "Follow me" into your everyday routines this week, what part of your life do you think He would be stepping into first?
2. How does Jesus' picture of the vine and branches change the way you think about growth in your faith—especially when life feels busy or unproductive?
3. What does it mean to "remain" or "abide" in Christ practically?

#### Live It: (Applying to Our Lives)

1. What daily responsibilities or distractions most easily crowd out quiet time with Jesus for you right now?
2. Where have you noticed changes in your heart, attitude, or reactions that feel more like God's work in you than your own effort?
3. Looking at your current season of life, where do you see God using you to bless or encourage someone—even in small, quiet way?





## GOD TIME: Discovering Life — A New Sermon Series

It is easy to assume that life's most meaningful chapters are already behind us—to quietly settle into the idea that the best stories have been told, the biggest moments have passed, and what remains is simply maintenance. Many of us would never say that out loud, but if we are honest, we sometimes live as though it were true. Yet what if that assumption is wrong? What if this season—right now—could be the most fruitful, purposeful, and fulfilling chapter of your life?

This is the invitation at the heart of this new sermon series, *Discovering Life*. Together, we will walk with Jesus at the very beginning of His ministry, when nothing looks impressive yet, and no one involved seems especially qualified. We will watch as He calls ordinary people—fishermen, skeptics, seekers—into an extraordinary life with God. Again and again, Jesus refuses to let people settle for less than what the Father desires to give.

This series is not about nostalgia or chasing a younger version of faith. It is about attentiveness—learning to listen again for Christ's voice in the present moment. It is about discovering that life with God is not something we once had or hope to have someday, but something Jesus offers us now. Here. In this season.

As we follow these early encounters with Jesus, we will be guided by a simple but profound truth: **"Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit"** (Galatians 5:25). This is an invitation to move with God—into deeper faith, renewed purpose, and Spirit-led living—trusting that the life Jesus promises is still unfolding, and that He is not finished with us yet.



## GO TIME: Forward Together — Faithful With What God Has Given

There are moments in a congregation when faith moves from conversation to action—when prayerful discernment becomes obedience. This is one of those moments. It is Go Time. In Matthew 25, Jesus tells the Parable of the Talents. The sharpest warning is not aimed at the servants who tried and put things at risk, but at the one who was afraid and did nothing. Faithfulness is not about preserving what we have at all costs. It is about putting to work what God has entrusted to us—for His purposes, in His time—trusting Him rather than retreating into fear.

God has given Victory Lutheran many gifts: faithful people, inspiring worship, clear biblical teaching, caring leaders, and generous hearts. We have never questioned whether we have been blessed—we have. The question is whether we will step into those blessings with courage in this season.

That is what Victory Forward represents. For a defined, prayerfully discerned season, your leaders chose not to pull back, but to lean forward into mission—investing time, energy, and resources so the Gospel might reach more people. This has never been about carelessness. It has been about faith: believing God does not call His church to bury its gifts, but to use them. And God has been faithful. As of December 28, year-end giving brought us very close to covering our 2025 ministry expenses, and gifts still being received may yet bring us to fully fund our ministry. Once our fiscal year books close, we will share the final numbers.

And so we give thanks—and keep going. This is not a season to pull back—it is go time. As we look ahead, let us continue to support the ministry and outreach of Victory, trusting God to multiply what is offered in faith. We move forward not driven by fear, but grounded in faith and hope, stewarding what God has entrusted to us with care while trusting Him to use this church to share the Good News of Jesus now and in the years ahead. To God alone be the glory.
