



BEYOND VALENTINE'S: THE GREATER LOVE

Did you know, the first Valentine was posted around 1806? Currently, almost one billion Valentine's Day cards are sent each year on or near February 14. It is second only to Christmas! That is a strong showing for the consumerist side of Valentine's. However, we don't want to idolize romantic love. This is a good time to appreciate the many forms of love in our lives and most importantly, the true Source of Love — God.

There are at least three different types of love that we find in the New Testament: eros, philos, and agape. Eros is romantic love. Philos is love between a brother, sister, or friend. Agape is divine love. It is unconditional and selfless. When we talk about love in the Christian faith, we are talking about agape love. It is a love that is patient, kind, and, most importantly, unconditional.

Paul writes: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs" (1 Corinthians 13:4-5). This is the love we are called to show—whether we're loving our families, our neighbors, our friends, or even strangers. It's not about grand gestures or perfect feelings; it's about small acts of kindness, forgiveness, and patience. It's about loving when it's difficult, and offering grace when it's needed most. In fact, one of the most profound ways we can show Christ's love is through service. Jesus said, "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:31). May this Valentine's Day be a beautiful reminder to broaden our view of what love can be.

Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged.

Financial Update: We Finished in the Black!

I want to share some genuinely encouraging news: we finished fiscal year 2025 in the black. Income covered expenses!

For much of 2025 there was, at times, a slight pall hanging over us because giving was trending below what was needed. And it's worth remembering that the 2025 ministry plan actually anticipated a deficit. Your Church Council approached that reality with wisdom and steadiness, putting a responsible plan in place to fund the gap while Victory continues staffing up for growth and pursuing robust ministry.



And then the Lord provided — though, in truth, He has been with us and working all along.

As we close the 2025 year, we give thanks to God for His indescribable gift in Christ and for the generous hearts He continues to shape among us. Your giving flowed from gratitude, not obligation, and the year-end response was a genuine testimony to God's work in this congregation. Because so many stepped forward — many with generous stretch gifts — our shared mission is strengthened, the reach of the Gospel continues to expand, and Victory is well positioned to keep moving forward together. We do so not driven by fear, but grounded in faith and hope, stewarding God's gifts with care and responsibility while trusting Him to use this church to share the Good News of Jesus today and in the years ahead. To God alone be the glory.

This result also reflects faithful stewardship behind the scenes. Throughout the year, Victory's staff managed expenses with great care—making hard choices to not spend, to delay, to adjust, and to find simpler paths forward. That kind of diligent financial management isn't flashy, but it is deeply faithful, and it truly contributed to this outcome. In the same way, Council's steady oversight and courageous leadership helped keep Victory moving toward God's vision, even when the numbers felt uncertain.

And so, to borrow Jesus' words: Well done, good and faithful stewards!

Scripture puts words to what we're feeling today: "And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8).

This is worth celebrating — because it means we can move forward with confidence, momentum, and gratitude for what God is doing among us. And we are not slowing down. By God's grace, we will keep reaching out, welcoming new people, and pressing forward in growth and mission — sharing Jesus in Mesa and beyond, investing in outreach, and continuing to expand the reach of the Gospel through Victory Forward and the ministries the Lord has entrusted to us.

So let me offer one simple encouragement as we step into this next season together: keep up the generous stewardship. Not out of pressure, and not out of fear — but as an ongoing act of worship, gratitude, and trust. God is using your faithfulness to bless people you may never meet on this side of heaven.

SERMON SERIES: DISCOVERING LIFE

January 31 & February 1, 2026

"Step Alongside & Disciple" - Matthew 28:18-20

Jesus doesn't merely send us out with a task — He sends us out with His authority, His promise, and His steady presence, so that no disciple ever walks alone. Discipleship is how the mission actually moves forward: we strengthen one another, entrust faith to reliable people, and help others learn to follow Jesus in real, everyday life. God may lead you to step toward someone — mentoring a younger believer, discipling a child or grandchild, or leading a small group — so that what He is growing in you becomes a blessing that multiplies in others.

February 7 & 8, 2026

"Step Forward & Serve" - Mark 10:42-45

Jesus redefines greatness by turning the world upside down: In His kingdom, the way up is down — real influence looks like serving, and real leadership looks like laying down your life for others. From that posture of humble love, the church is sent outward — not with swagger or pressure, but with a promise of power and purpose as the Spirit makes ordinary people bold witnesses. This week is an invitation to step into mission through service: think global, serve local. Prayerfully consider joining with one of Victory's Mission initiatives or partnerships; take a tangible step toward mission as God uses your life to reach farther than you ever imagined.

February 14 & 15, 2026

"Step Together & Persevere" - Luke 9:28-36

At his transfiguration, Jesus gives His disciples a glimpse of glory — not so they can stay on the mountain, but so their hearts are anchored for the road ahead as He sets His face toward the cross. As we learn to follow Him through real life, scripture reminds us what this looks like day to day: lay aside what weighs you down, run with perseverance, and keep your eyes fixed on Jesus — the One who endured for you and now strengthens you to endure. This week is an invitation to take your 2026 next step and to do it together — inviting, connecting, discipling, and sending — because the Christian journey is lifelong, and God uses His people to help one another keep moving forward.

NEW SERMON SERIES: STEPS TO THE CROSS

Now we follow Jesus to the cross. Jesus' kingdom repeatedly clashes with the one of this world. God's kingdom is described as one much more powerful than the one of Pilate and the high priests. Still, Jesus remains obedient, trusting that all power comes from God and continuing his journey to the cross. As the crowd denies their faith and proclaims Caesar their only lord, Jesus is crucified with the mocking inscription of King of the Jews. Jesus dies, and is buried in the garden in a quiet ceremony, but the true power of God's kingdom is yet to be revealed.

February 21 & 22, 2026



Jesus Raises Lazarus — John 11:17-44

As Lent begins, we follow Jesus into the collision between the kingdoms of this world and the Kingdom of God — and in Bethany we see that clash up close as Jesus delays, grief deepens, and death seems to win. Yet when Jesus stands at the tomb and calls Lazarus by name, the Creator who gives breath to every living thing speaks life into what is hopeless, revealing a power far greater than fear, authority, or the grave.

February 27 & March 1, 2026

Jesus Serves — John 11:17-44

Jesus and his disciples eat a meal together prior to Passover. Jesus washes their feet and instructs them to follow his example of love and service.



LENTEN SERMON SERIES: OUT OF THE DEPTHS

This Lenten season, join us as we journey to the cross through the Psalms. Every Wednesday, we will focus and reflect on a different Psalm, lamenting our own despair as we look to the cross for our salvation. Each day of Lent (Monday - Saturday, Sundays aren't counted) for the 40 days of Lent, a portion of a psalm is printed for you along with a devotional written by members of our staff and our congregation. While only a portion of the psalm is in this booklet, we encourage you to read the entire psalm as well as the devotional as part of your daily Lenten journey.


The spiritual discipline of reciting the psalms has its roots in ancient Israel. Hundreds of thousands of Jewish pilgrims would make their annual trek into Jerusalem for three major festivals: Passover, Pentecost, and the Feast of Tabernacles. These faithful people would sing the Psalms, specifically Psalms 120-134, as they climbed the hills into Jerusalem and ascended the 15 stairs leading into the Temple to worship God. You can think of these psalms as "road trip" songs. These psalms kept the travelers focused on the LORD instead of on their sore feet and hungry bellies.

The Psalms express the full range of human experience—joy, fear, anger, gratitude, doubt, hope, repentance, and praise. They are a prayer book God gives us when we don't have the words ourselves. The psalms speak when we can't.

We pray that as you take this journey through the Psalms with us, you experience the Psalms to celebrate your trust in God with a renewed focus on Him, even when you are walking through the valleys of life. We thank everyone who contributed to the devotional booklet and invite us all to journey together.

May God bless you on this Lenten journey.

Wednesday, February 18 — Ash Wednesday "The Shepherd Who Dies" - John 10:1-18, Psalm 23

How many voices have promised to lead you to safety, only to disappear when the wolves showed up? We've all known hired hands who were there for the paycheck but gone at the first sign of danger, leaving us exposed and afraid in our darkest moments. Ash Wednesday reminds us we're dust, fragile and easily scattered—but it also introduces us to the one Shepherd who doesn't just risk his life for the sheep, he willingly lays it down. The cross is where we discover that Jesus doesn't lead from a safe distance; he enters our desperation, calls us by name, and proves his love by dying the death we deserve.

Wednesday, February 25 "Out of the Depths" - Psalm 130

When the waters close over your head and you can't tell which way is up anymore, where do you turn? The psalmist knows that darkness—the kind that makes you wonder if God can even hear your voice from where you've sunk. This Lent, we discover that the deepest pits are exactly where God's waiting arms reach furthest, and that our desperate cries aren't interruptions to His attention—they're invitations to His rescue.

LENTEN SERMON SERIES: OUT OF THE DEPTHS

Wednesday, March 4

"When Your Bones Ache" - Psalm 6

There's a weariness that goes deeper than tired—when grief soaks your pillow every night and even your bones feel the weight of sorrow. The psalmist doesn't sugarcoat it: sometimes following God means walking through valleys where tears are your only companion and questions outnumber answers. But even here, especially here, we learn that God doesn't love us less in our weakness; He loves us through it.

Wednesday, March 11

"The Wounds We Carry" - Psalm 38

What do you do when the weight of your own failures becomes too heavy to bear, when even your closest friends step back, and the silence of heaven feels deafening? This is the raw honesty of Lent—acknowledging that our sin has real consequences, our wounds run deep, and sometimes we stand utterly alone with our guilt. Yet the cross proves that God doesn't wait for us to clean ourselves up; He meets us in our mess with wounds that heal our own.

Wednesday, March 18

"Fading Away" - Psalm 102

When you feel like you're disappearing—your strength gone, your purpose unclear, your prayers bouncing off the ceiling—you're closer to the cross than you realize. The afflicted one who wrote this psalm felt forgotten, withering away while the world moved on without noticing. This is the cry of everyone who's ever felt invisible, and it's the very place where Jesus became most visible, bearing the weight of our fading into his own body on the cross.

Wednesday, March 25

"Satisfied In You" - Psalm 42

Why does your soul feel so dry when you're surrounded by people telling you God should be enough? The psalmist's honesty cuts through the pretense: sometimes our thirst for God feels more like drowning in His absence, and our memories of His presence only sharpen the pain of His seeming distance. Lent doesn't promise to quench this thirst immediately—it invites us to bring our desperate, honest longing to the only one who can satisfy it, even when the wait feels unbearable.





VICTORY SAFETY & SECURITY

Two words we often hear from newcomers are that Victory is 'joyful' and it is 'loving'. And they say this not even knowing that these are two words are in our vision statement! Our hope is that Victory will be a joyful and loving community.

People feel joyful and loved when they are cared for. One of the ways we want to care for people — YOU! — at Victory is to keep them safe while they worship during weekend services, study the Bible during the week, and have fun at one of our events. To that end, staff and volunteers have been working to create a plan for inclement weather events, medical emergencies, or even an intruder situation.

In their January meeting, the Church Council voted to approve a Safety & Security Policy for Victory. A Safety & Security team of volunteers is forming to build and execute a plan for each event. A Medical Emergency Response Team, that includes former medical professionals and other volunteers, has created a plan for action if a medical emergency arises. Needed equipment has been purchased and training is ongoing.

There are many troubling events happening in our country. We want you to know that your safety – individually and corporately – is very important to us and we are planning accordingly. 


