

**Dear Victory Family,**

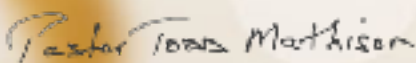
The turning of the calendar always invites reflection. New Year's resolutions come easily; deeper peace does not. As we step into a new year—unknown days, uncharted challenges, and unexpected gifts—the apostle Paul offers a prayer-shaped promise: rejoice, pray honestly, give thanks freely, and entrust what you cannot control to God. The result, Paul says, is not the absence of difficulty, but the peace of God that transcends all understanding—a peace that guards hearts and minds when life does not go according to plan.

As many of you heard the final weekend of December, I want to share again why our upcoming Winter Study has changed. I recently learned that I will be undergoing scheduled open-heart bypass surgery on January 22. This was not news I anticipated receiving, and I am still adjusting to it. In the weeks leading up to surgery, I'll be paying close attention to stress and pacing myself wisely. I will continue working and preaching, but with a lighter schedule, and I will step back from teaching the Winter Study. After surgery, I'll focus fully on recovery for a number of weeks.

Because that timing would likely interrupt the Romans study partway through, we felt it was wise to postpone it for now. The good news is that we had already planned strong follow-on studies on Spiritual Gifts and Adult Confirmation, and those will move forward as scheduled. During this time, Pastors Denton and Renee will be preaching more, and our staff team has planned carefully for this brief season. You will be well cared for.

Most of all, I want you to know this: I am genuinely at peace. In a steady and very real way, I am experiencing the peace Paul describes—grounding, sustaining, and deeply reassuring. I trust that God will use this season to deepen my compassion and shape me into a more understanding pastor, able to walk alongside you in ways that are already familiar to so many. Thank you for your prayers, your kindness, and for walking with Anne and me into this new year—trusting not in what we know, but in the God who holds us fast.

FAITHFUL STEWARDSHIP IN THIS SEASON

In Matthew 25, Jesus tells a story called the Parable of the Talents. It teaches us that being faithful is not about holding on to what we have but about using it wisely. The strongest warning is not for the servant who tried and took a risk, but for the one who was afraid and did nothing.

Victory Lutheran Church has been given many good gifts. We have faithful people, inspiring worship, clear Bible teaching, caring leaders, and generous givers. The question is not whether we have been given much—we have. The question is whether we will use those gifts in the right way. As leaders, our goal is not to stay comfortable or avoid risk, but to live in a way that would lead Jesus to say, “Well done, good and faithful servant.”

At our Annual Meeting last November, it was noted that Victory has been spending more than we receive for the past two years and that this approach will continue into 2026. While the 2026 spending plan was formally approved, I recognize the need to explain the purpose and reasoning behind it more clearly. Here is the story.

Victory is in year two of a three-year plan approved by the Church Council to intentionally spend more than we receive for a short time. This did not happen by accident, and it was not caused by a crisis. It was a careful and prayerful decision. The Council chose to use some of our savings to support ministry during a time of pastoral and staff change that would lead to growth.

This plan was never meant to last forever. The Council does not believe that spending more than we receive is sustainable over the long term. This approach has not been about carelessness, but about using what God has given us wisely and faithfully for a specific season—just as we seek to do in every season.

At the end of 2023, Victory had over \$600,000 set aside for regular ministry expenses. Rather than holding all of those funds indefinitely, the Council prayerfully chose to use a portion of them for ministry, which is why the money was given in the first place. Even with this intentional use, Victory still has over \$400,000 in savings. Staff will continue to monitor spending carefully, and the Council will prayerfully review the 2027 budget as we move forward together.

Frequently Asked Questions: Victory's Ministry and Finances



Is Victory Lutheran Church broke?

No. Victory is financially stable. We currently have over \$400,000 in savings set aside for regular ministry expenses, in addition to nearly the same amount reserved for designated purposes. We are intentionally using a portion of these funds to support ministry growth in this season. This is not about survival; it is about faithfully and wisely stewarding the resources God has entrusted to us.



Why are we spending more than we receive right now?

This approach is part of a three-year plan approved by the Church Council. It is temporary and closely monitored. The purpose is to support ministry during a season of pastoral and staff transition, not to create long-term challenges. Faithfulness means wisely using what God has given us, rather than holding back out of fear.



Is the staff overspending the budget?

No. As of November 30, 2025, staff spending was 7% under budget, which is \$94,055 less than planned. This shows careful and responsible spending.



How can we afford our pastoral staff?

Victory currently has four pastors—two full-time and two part-time. At the same time, we are taking intentional steps to manage costs responsibly.

For 2026, overall staff costs have been reduced by 3%. In addition, we have adjusted staffing roles in practical ways:

- ▶ The Chaplain position has been reduced to half-time.
- ▶ The AVL Coordinator position has been reduced to part-time.

These were difficult decisions, made carefully and prayerfully to steward our resources well and protect the long-term health of the church.



How can we afford Victory @ Leisure World?

Victory @ Leisure World is set up to support itself.

- ▶ We do not pay rent at Leisure World Café.
- ▶ The first six months of the pastor's small stipend are already paid for outside the budget.
- ▶ Giving there has covered its monthly costs.

This means it does not take money away from the rest of the church.



As of December 28, year-end giving brought us very close to covering all of our 2025 ministry expenses!



What have we spent the extra money on?

The spending has been intentional and planned.

- ▶ 2024 Year One focused on building appropriate staffing during a time of significant change. We also launched our Contemporary Worship Service in April.
- ▶ 2025 Year Two focused on stabilizing staff and investing in Victory Forward growth and outreach.
- ▶ 2026 Year Three is focusing on expanded outreach, seeing ministry results, and growing our mission.

Victory Forward represents over \$114,000 of the 2026 budget and directly supports the mission and direction approved by the Church Council.



Has giving at Victory decreased?

No. Giving at Victory has remained steady over the past two years. In fact, giving increased by nearly 7% in 2023 and has continued at that same level since then. This steady support reflects the faithfulness and generosity of our church family and makes our shared ministry possible. Our prayer and our plan are to continue growing stewardship and generosity so that our ministry can expand and reach even more people.



How did our finances end up this year?

We are deeply thankful. **As of December 28, year-end giving brought us very close to covering all of our 2025 ministry expenses**, and gifts still being received in these final days of the year may bring us to fully fund our ministry. Once our fiscal year books officially close, we will share the confirmed numbers.



What should I remember most?

What is already clear is this: God moved His people to respond with generous and grateful hearts. As we close the year, we give thanks to God for His indescribable gift in Christ and for the generous hearts He continues to shape among us. Your giving flowed from gratitude, not obligation, and the year-end response was a genuine testimony to God's work in this congregation.

Because so many of you stepped forward—many with generous stretch gifts—our shared mission is strengthened, the reach of the Gospel continues to expand, and Victory is well positioned to keep moving forward together. We do so not driven by fear, but grounded in faith and hope, stewarding God's gifts with care and responsibility while trusting Him to use this church to share the Good News of Jesus today and in the years ahead. To God alone be the glory.

NEW SERMON SERIES:

DISCOVERING LIFE

It is easy to assume that life's most meaningful chapters are behind us, but what if this season could be the most fruitful, purposeful, and fulfilling of all? In *Discovering Life*, we walk with Jesus at the very beginning of His ministry as He calls ordinary people into an extraordinary life with God, challenging us to move beyond settling for less. This series invites us to discover the life Jesus offers right now and to listen anew for His call into deeper faith, renewed purpose, and Spirit-led living in this present season.

January 3 & 4, 2026

"Step Into The Journey" - Matthew 4:18-22

Jesus issues a personal, timely, and life-changing invitation—not to a program, but to Himself—calling us to follow Him and trust that He is the One who will shape our lives. Discipleship is not about striving harder, but about abiding deeper in Christ, the true Vine, who forms us by grace and bears fruit through us. And as Jesus' call leads us to the Table, we are invited to receive His life given for us and to prayerfully ask, "What is my next step with Jesus in 2026?"

January 10 & 11, 2026

"Step Out & Invite" - John 1:40-46

The gospel most often spreads through simple, personal invitations—one friend bringing another to meet Jesus, one life changed at a time. When people encounter Christ, they naturally want others to experience that same grace, and faith grows as invitations are extended around tables, in conversations, and through everyday relationships. This message calls each of us to take a clear next step: prayerfully and intentionally invite one person to Victory this year, trusting Jesus to do what only He can do.

January 17 & 18, 2026

"Step In & Connect" - Acts 2:42-47

God never designed the Christian life to be lived alone; faith grows best when it is shared, practiced, and lived out with others. While authentic community requires risk—being honest, vulnerable, and open to the possibility of rejection or losing our independence—those very risks are the pathway to deeper faith and lasting spiritual growth. God invites us to step into a radically counter-cultural way of life by connecting with others in genuine Christian community, trusting that God meets us and shapes us most powerfully when we walk together rather than alone.

January 24 & 25, 2026

"Step Up & Grow" - Colossians 2:6-9, 11-15

The Christian life is a daily, ongoing journey of learning to live more fully in Christ, letting our lives be shaped by who he is and what he has already done for us. As we remain rooted in Christ, our faith grows strong and steady—not through self-effort, but through a deepening trust in the saving work that has set us free and given us new life. We are invited into everyday practices of Scripture and prayer, not as religious tasks, but as the means by which God anchors us, grows us, and empowers us to live confidently as disciples of Jesus in the world.

ABOUT FAMILY PROMISE:

WE STOP HOMELESSNESS BEFORE IT STARTS

We help at-risk families with past rent and deposit assistance so they can remain in a home together and never have to experience homelessness.

WE KEEP A FAMILY TOGETHER

We keep the family together (including their pets), because in times of crisis, that's where people find the strength that leads to success.

WE STAY WITH A FAMILY

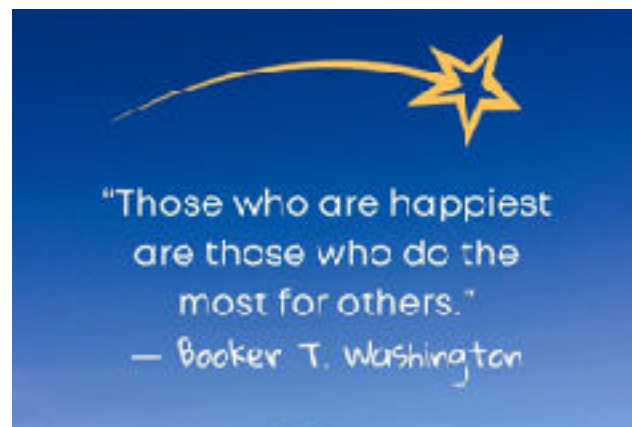
Through our Stabilization Program, we support families after they leave our emergency shelter to ensure they become self-sufficient and can stay in their home long-term.

WE PARTNER WITH THE COMMUNITY

We have over 3,000 volunteers and 38 faith congregations that help provide overnight shelter and show love and kindness to homeless kids and their parents when they need it most.

WE ARE FINANCIALLY RESPONSIBLE

Because of our community partnership model and a 60-day shelter protocol, our average costs are less than half the typical family shelter. More than 75% of every gift goes directly to our work with homeless families.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Setup 4:00-5:00pm &

Takedown 6:30am-7:30am

Volunteers set up the accommodations on Sunday afternoon. This includes blowing up the beds, making them, and arranging the rooms for the families. Likewise, when the families leave, the following Sunday morning, volunteers take down and repack all the beds.

Meal Volunteers, 5:00pm-7:00pm

Dinner is a hot meal and can be prepared at volunteer's home and brought in or at the church. Other volunteers help setup the meal and are encouraged to have dinner and fellowship with the families.

Overnight Hosts, 7:00pm – 6:30am

These volunteers join the families for dinner. After dinner they may participate in activities with the children.

Laundry Helpers

These volunteers pick up laundry mid-week or on Sunday. Return washed and folded.

As we wrap up 2025 and look ahead to 2026, I am deeply grateful for every member of the Family Promise community. Your generosity, prayers, and advocacy are turning challenges into opportunities, uncertainty into security, and worry into joy. From all of us at Family Promise, thank you for making these holidays brighter for families across Arizona. May your season be full of peace, love, and joy, and may we continue to walk together in hope in the year ahead.

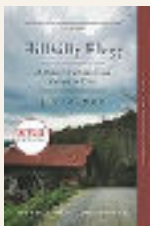
